2 on 3 Hours at 7 O'clock Shorten Sails

Latter Part More Pleasant
With Passing Clouds Wind SW
Steering WSW So ends these 24
Hours. Lat by Ob 38.36
Long by DR 38 47
Long by Chron 38.43

Saturday August 12th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Brisk
Breezes from the SW and Boreday at 7 Shorten
Sails

Middle Part the Same

Latter Part Same as the first Thick and
Squally With Heavy Showers of Rain at 12
O'clock more Pleasant So Ends these 24 Hours
With one Whale man on our Lee

Sunday August 13th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Pleasant
Breezes and Boreday Wind SW Headed to the
South Eastwards at 7 O'clock Shorten Sails

Middle Part Strong Breezes

Latter Part Maid Short Sails
Strong Gale from the same quarter
at 9 O'clock Shorten Sails. Ends With Strong
Gales and Heavy Rain
