Tuesday August 15 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong
Gales and Ruff at 2 O'clock Saw black fish
going back to windward at 7 O'clock Shorten
Sails Wind SW
Headed to the Westward Middle Part the Same

Latter Part Strong Gales and a
Heavy Swell on End with Light Shower
and flying Seeds Headed to the Westward

Wednesday August 16 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong
Breezes and a Ruff sea on to wind W
Headed to Saw a Sail on our Weather Beam
at 7 O'clock Shorten Sails

Middle Part Moderate

Latter Part the Same Made all Sails
Wind SW at 7 O'clock Jack Ship Saw
one school of Porpoises So Ends these 24 Hours

Thursday August 17 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hour Pleasant
Breezes from the W Standing to the W Seas
Saw the Lagoon 14 Miles on
our Weather Beam at 7 Shorten Sails

Middle Part
the Same

Latter Part Breeze Breezes and Thick
at 4 O'clock Close Reef Saw a whale brigg
on our Lee Tendency to the South
Ends Cloudy and Rainy
