Same as the first But Rainy and Thick
at 12 O'clock Tack Ship to the Westward

Saturday August 19th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Breeze
Breezes from the WSW Headed to the South
Saw a Brig on Weather Beam and Lee Quarter at
7 O'clock Shorten Sail

Middle Part More
Moderate at 2 Worn Round

Latter Part Cloudy Thick and Rainy
at 6 Tack Ship with Lite Squalls from the
WSW at 11 O'clock Tack Ship at 12 O'clock Heavy
Squalls from the WSW Headed to the
SW took in all Sails Ends with Thunder
and Heavy Showers of Rain

Sunday August 20th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong
Gale from the West Headed to the North
at 1 O'clock Clear over Head at 7 More
Moderate

Middle Part the
Same

Latter Part Wind and Weather the Same
as the Middle at 9 O'clock Head to
with Strong Gale from the West with a
Large Swell on S. Ends these 24 Hours
with Flying Sands

Monday August 21st 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong
Gale from the Westward Saw a Ship Steaming
E & E at 4 O'clock Sent down some Topgallant
Yards at 7 Worn Ship Wind WNW

Middle Part Moderate

Latter Part Strong Gale from the
WNW Headed WSW Saw a Sail on
Over Lee Beam Ends with Strong
Gale and Flying Sands
