Saturday October 7 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong Gale
from the SW Headed to the Westward
at 2 O'clock Maid Flores ahead at 5 O'clock Past
between Flores and Carve Heavy Squalls with
Rain came of the Land Look in all Proper Sail
at 6 o'clock Wind West Bore Round Steered
ESE

Middle Part More Moderate at 10

Came up &

Latter Part Same as the Middle
with a high Beat Sea Wind in Steering W. at 10
O'clock Flores Bore abt 8 by Comp Set 28 miles
from which I take my Departure In the Lat
39.26 and Long 81.7W Lat In 38.58
Long In 81.12

Sunday October 8 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Lite
breeze from the North and Pleasant

Middle Part Calm

Latter Part Lite Breeze from the
SE Headed to Sent up Fore Topgallant
Yard and Sat Fore Topmas Steadily sail
at 12 O'clock Wind South Look in the
Studdensail So Ends these 24 Hours.

Thermometer 79 69° at 70. Lat by Ob 38.38
Variation 2 Points Long by Ob 82.06
Westward Long by Chro 81.53
