Brisk Breezes from the SW and Cloudy
He added to the W & S

to the North where Ship Headded West
Ends Stormy and a Ruff Sea
So much so that the Cook cut his hand
Very bad

Wednesday October 11th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Strong Gales from the W and Rainy
at 11 O'clock Rooled the Lee Boat under
Close Reffed all Round Took the Craft
out of the

Middle Part the Same
at 12 O'clock Chard of Wind W & E

Latter Part the Same and Pleasant
with Passing Clouds Made all Proper
Sail Wind More Moderate Sea More
Regular So Ends these 24 Hours

Thursday October 12th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Brisk Breezes from the W & E Headded
West

Middle Part Wind from
North to W & E and Light at 2 O'clock
Set Fore Topgallant Sail and Topmast
Studdensail

Latter Part Same as the Middle
with Light Spirals of Rain Saw
few Spriggs of Weed So Ends these 24 Hours

Thermometer 71° W
Variation 2 Points
