Tuesday October 24 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong
Gale from the North Carrying all Provisions
Sail at 4 O'clock at Large Ship Limited
Port Under Our Lee

Middle Part More
Moderate Sat. For Top Sail and Jib
Reefed

Latter Part Same as the Middle
but Squally Wind to the North S. Ends
then 24 Hour

Current S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ Knot	Lat by DR 35 14
Thermometer 70° W	Long by Obs 62-55
