Wednesday November 1 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours more
Moderate Lat at Double Reefed Mainmast
and Fore Tails and Fore Top sail Reefed
Wend W & M Standing with our
Starboard Tacks on Board

Middle Part Strong Flaws and
Cloudy Wind NW Thermometer 65°
Water Air 62°

Latter Part still more moderate
and smooth at 10 O'clock Spoke the
Sarah of Nantucket 24 Months out
24 Hundred busy Employed in fishing
the Gibb Room So Ends these 24 Hours

Thermometer 65° W Lat by Ob 36.57
Air 62° Long by Chro 72.31
Long by SR 72.04

Thursday November 2 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Little breeze from NW to SW Tack
Ship to the W Eastward at 6 O'clock finish
the Gibb Room and sent the Jib
Set the same and Fore Top mast Studd
Sail Wind West

Middle Part Cloudy and Thick Strong
breeze from the NW Tack in
the Studdensail

Latter Part Strong
breeze from the NW and clear Saw
a brig and scho to Leeward Thermometer
55° Water 69° Lat by Ob 38.28

Long by Chro 72.18
Long by SR 71.55

Friday November 3 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Strong North Wester Heaving with our
Starboard Tacks on Board at 4 O'clock
Thermometer 66° Water Air 55° Saw 2 ships
Heaving SW at 2 O'clock we Close Reefed

Middle Part more
Moderate at 8 O'clock saw a sail One
our Lee beam

Latter Part Moderate
Wind from NW to W Main all sail
Saw 2 sails of our Lee Quarter and on
our weather Quarter Thermometer 66°
Water Air 53° So Ends Lat by Ob 39.21
this day Variation 13° East Long by SR 70.46
Long by Chro 70.52
