

Remarks on board Bark Arushan No. 1 S. L. Bow  
Friday January 17th 1862

this day commenced with a light breeze from the Southward all sail set steering to the S.W. I had a very sensitive Dream (as this afternoon at 4 AM when in the Latitude of 34° 13' and Longitude 142° 26' East I thought I was at home, of meeting my Sister of a blessing offering and of a sacrifice on my part of a confession on her part, one upon a Death bed and the other seated by the side of it. This is the first time I think that I have ever dreamed of Elizabeth this voyage, middle and latter part much like the fore part

Latitude 18° 11' S  
Longitude 144° 45' East

Saturday January 18th 1862

this day commenced with a moderate breeze from the Northward, steering by the wind at 3:30 PM signalled a Sloop Schooner (English) - middle and latter part - light breeze from the S.W. the sails in sight about 11 AM lowered the three masts after Black Fish, the greater boats each caught two whilst the main caught but one, this was the first Black Fish that I was ever fast to since I have been going Whaling, which was eight years last September, so ends then twenty four hours, Latitude 18° South Longitude 133° 30' East

Sunday January 19th 1862

this day commenced with a moderate breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. employed the fore part - clearing away Black Fish, middle part fore breeze all sail set at 3 AM I was quite sick (a sick head ache) went below and slept until 7 AM and then felt somewhat relieved, employed the latter part minding Black Fish, Latitude 17° 30' S Longitude 124° 50' E

Monday January 20th 1862

this day commenced with a moderate breeze from the S.W. steering North, at 1 PM left to the wind for some kind of a whale raised him of deck about 3:30 PM left the ship he came, middle and latter part much like the fore part employed the latter part minding Black Fish, Latitude 16° 20' S Longitude 114° 00' E

Capt. Cleveland of Carcase January 1862

Tuesday January 21st 1862

this day commenced with a strong breeze from the S.W. all sail set steering N. at 3:30 PM raised the main - Backs, ran for them thinking they might be skin at 3:30 PM of her course, strong breeze ship going about eight knot I should judge, middle and latter part much like the fore part - Latitude 14° 12' S Longitude 127° 12' E

Wednesday January 22nd 1862

this day commenced with a strong breeze from the Southward, all sail set steering N.W. middle and latter part - more moderate so in the fore part - these twenty four hours Latitude 12° 22' S Longitude 124° 35' East

Thursday January 23rd 1862

this day commenced with a fresh breeze from the Southward, steering N.W. at 3 PM. at the Stagnis and J. M. Studdingait, middle and latter part much like the fore part - Latitude 11° South Longitude 122° 58' East

Friday January 24th 1862

this day commenced with a fresh breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. middle part - moderate latter part - light Latitude 11° S Longitude 124° 50' E

Saturday January 25th 1862

this day commenced with a light breeze from the Southward, all sail set steering N.W. middle and latter part - moderate breeze, no observation

Sunday January 26th 1862

this day commenced with a light breeze from the Southward, all sail set steering N.W. middle and latter part much like the fore part - Longitude 114° 58' 21"

Monday January 27th 1862

this day commenced with a moderate breeze from the between S.W. & W. at 5 PM. left to the wind and lowered the Lightboard beam after Black Fish struck but drawn
