Remains on board Sunday November 22nd 1829

All these 24 hours light airs and calm with cloudy weather, first part tried the current found it setting N. 1 mile per hour

Latitude by Obs 7:38. Long 21:50 W

Monday Nov 23rd

First part light airs and calm see black fish and chased them. Middle part calm

Latter part light airs from East, two sail in sight. Latitude by Obs 7:17. South. Long by Obs 22:10

Tuesday Nov 24th

It still continues with light airs and calm attended with hard showers of rain, thunder and lightning. Latter part, see three ships two of them working to the South, and one to the North

Latitude by Obs 6:58. South. Long by Obs 22:20 W

Wednesday November 25th

First part light airs from the S.W. At 3 p.m. spoke ~~the~~ ^{the} Frigate Java, from India bound to England. Middle and latter part calm with squalls of rain, Lat by Obs 6:42. S Long 22:35

Thursday Nov 26th

First and middle part calm with showers of rain. Latter part light breezes from the Eastward, with squalls of rain. two sail in sight a head. Latitude by Obs 6:18. S Long by Obs 22:50 W

Friday November 27th

First part light breezes with fair weather, see several shoals of black fish. lower, Dana got one for lamp oil. light Middle part light breezes from E.S.E. Latter part the same, 7 sail in sight. Latitude by Obs 5:30. Long by Obs 23:00 W

Saturday Nov 28th

First & Middle part light breezes and variable from East to South. Latter part, from 4 to 10 a.m. light baffling winds, with hard showers of rain, thunder and lightning. Ends with fine breezes from S.E. to S.W. steering on the western tack. Latitude by Obs 4:43. S Long 23:30 W

Remarks on board Sunday November 29th

All these 24 hours gentle breezes from S.E. to S.W. with squalls of rain. Latitude by Obs 3:41. S Long

Monday Nov 30th

All these 24 hours fine whole sail breezes with fair weather, steering close hauled to the Southward. wind. S.E. by S. two sail in sight

Latitude by Obs 2:18. South Long by Obs 22:10

Tuesday December 1st 1829

All these 24 hours fresh trades from S.E. by S. with fair weather steering by the wind. All sail set broke one of the horns of the fore top mast cross-trees fitted a new one and got it on

Latitude by Obs 28 miles North. Long

Wednesday December 2nd

First part fresh trades with fair weather. At 2 p.m. took a lunar Obs which give the longitude 24:14 West. Middle and latter part fresh trades from S.E. by S. At 10 a.m. split the jib and sent it in and bent another

Latitude by Obs 1:03 South

Thursday Dec 3rd

First part fine trades from S.E. by S. with fair weather. Longitude by lunar at 2 p.m. was 25:14 W. Middle part strong trades, at S.E. took in the top gallant sails. Latter part strong trades, sent down the royal yards.

Friday Dec 4th Latitude by Obs 3:16 South
First part fresh trades from S.E. by S. steering S.W. Longitude by lunar. At 2 p.m. 26:18 W

Middle part strong trades, took in the top gallant sails and single reef the top sails. Latter part strong breezes, set the top gallant sails even single reef top sails

Latitude by Obs 5:51 South
