

Off Cape Horn

Remarks on board Thursday January 21st 1830
First part moderate breezes from N.W. and S.W.
At 10 past noon were ship to the S.W.
Middle part fresh breezes with thick weather
double reefed the top sails. Latter part fresh breeze
from S.W. and squally, steering by the wind
to the westward. Latitude by Obs 56:06 Long 83:00

Friday January 22nd

First part thick rainy weather, with strong
breezes from S.W. At 7 p.m. wind veered to
the S.W. wore ship, and steered S.W. by S.
Middle part, wind variable from S.W. to West
at all sail. Latter part fresh breezes from
W.S.W. with fair weather, steering by the wind
to the South. Latitude by Obs 54:48 Long 83:00

Saturday January 23rd

Commences fair weather, with fresh breezes from
West to S.W. At 4 p.m. thick weather, with strong
gales, close reefed the top sails, wore ship to the
westward. Middle part strong gales in the
S.W. with rain. Latter part moderate breezes
and variable. At 8 a.m. took ship to the South
Ends light breezes in the W.S.W. with pleasant
weather. Latitude by Obs 54:48. Long 84:00

Sunday January 24th

Commences squally weather, with a high irregular
swell, wind variable, from West to S.W. At 9
p.m. took ship to the South. Middle part moderate
breezes from West to W.S.W. steering S.W. by S.
Latter part gentle breezes, with very pleasant
weather, all sail set. Lat 53:57 Long 84:20

Monday January 25th

First part fair weather, wind light at West
Middle part, At 8 a.m. wind veered to the
South with strong breezes, took ship to the west-
ward. Latter part strong gales with rain. At
10 a.m. wind shifted suddenly to the W.S.W. wore
ship and steered S.W. Latitude by Obs 52:25 South
Longitude by Obs 87:30 West

Coats of Chili

Remarks on board Tuesday January 26th
First part strong gales in the W.S.W. with a
high sea, steering S.W. under double reef top
sails and fore sail. Middle part thick cloudy
weather with strong gales. Latter part
more moderate with fair weather. At 11 the
wind began to hallow to the South. This is
the first run for the whole 24 hours together
that I have had since I left the latitude of
40:00 and longitude of 48 West, never before
have had a fair wind to last, more ^{than} six or eight
hours at a time, since then. Lat 50:49 Long 85:30

Wednesday January 27th

First part moderate breezes from West to S.W.
Middle part At 10 p.m. wore ship to the west-
ward, wind S.W. by S. with thick rainy weather,
double reefed the top sails. Latter part wind
blowing on, At 7 a.m. wore too, with heads
a to the westward, Ends with harder gales in
the S.W. Latitude 49:12, Long by Obs 84:35 West

Thursday January 28th

Commences, harder gales with a high sea
At 2 p.m. wind veered to the W.S.W. wore
ship and steered S.W. under a reef, fore
sail and close reef, main top sail
Middle part At 10 more moderate set
double reef top sails. Latter part fair weather
with fine breezes in the W.S.W. set all sail
Longitude by Lunar At 1 past 11, was 84:15 W
Latitude At noon, 46:40 South

Friday January 29th

At all times 24 hours fair weather with fine
breezes in the W.S.W. steering S.W. by S.
Lat by Obs 43:36 Long by Lunar 85:32 West

Saturday January 30th

At all times 24 hours fine breezes from W.S.W. by S.
with thick cloudy weather. Lat 40:31 Long 83:00
Sunday January 31st
At all times 24 hours gentle breezes from S.W. to South
steering S.W. weather most of the time cloudy with fine
rain. Latitude by Obs 37:24 Longitude by Obs 82:30 West
