

Coast of Japan

Remarks on board Sunday July 18th 1830

First part employed a boiling and stowing down oil. At 4 p.m. finished stowing down the first whale. Middle part At 12 finished boiling. Latter part moderate and pleasant. saw a Ship to the windward a boiling.

Latitude by Obs 30.43 N. Long 168.30 East

Monday July 19th

All these 24 hours light easterly winds with pleasant weather. Latter part employed a stowing down oil.

Latitude by Obs 30.43 Long 168.00 E

Tuesday July 20th

First part pleasant weather. employed stowing down oil. At 4 p.m. saw a school of Whales three miles off going quick to the windward. lower, the boats and went after them, but they were going so quick and so wild that we could not get near them. At sundown returned on board and finished stowing off. Latter part employed setting up shooch cask. saw a sail a lead steering towards us. Lat 30.48 Long 168.00

Wednesday July 21st

First part light air from S.E. At 4 p.m. spoke the Ship Washington with 900 bbls. Middle part calm. Latter part light breeze from South. At 8 p.m. saw a school of Whales put off and got two, put the line from the third. At noon got them a long pole and began to cut. whilst we were a cutting one of the men

one boat got in the way of the blubber, as it was a saw slightly in, and knocked him down the latter then and hurt him very badly.

Remarks on board Thursday July 22^d

Pleasant weather. wind South. At 5 p.m. finished cutting and began to boil. Middle & Latter light variable winds with pleasant weather employed mending the stoven boat

Latitude by Obs 31.03 North Long 169.00 East

Friday July 23^d

All these 24 hours pleasant weather, with light winds from South, saw a great many finbacks. Longitude by lunar. At 11 p.m. 169.15 East Latitude by Obs 30.28 North

Saturday July 24th

First part fine breezes in the S.W. At 5 p.m. finished boiling. At 7 spoke the Washington, they had seen whales, but got none since I spoke him before. Latter part pleasant wind S.E. steering N.E. Latitude by Obs 30.58 North Longitude by lunar 168.53 East

Sunday July 25th

First part light breezes steering N.E. Middle part steered to the westward under short sail. Latter part set all sail steered to the westward, wind moderate from S.W. with squalls of rain

Latitude by Obs 31.00 Long by lunar 168.25 E

Monday July 26th

First part fair weather. wind S.W. Latter employed a stowing down oil. At noon too a squall from the Westward. Latitude 31.18 N. Long 168.00 East

Tuesday July 27th

First part squally. At 6 p.m. spoke the Ship Trident with 500 bbls. and John Palmer 400. Middle & Latter part strong breezes with hard squalls from S.W. and S.E. Latitude by Obs 30.53 Long 168.00 East
