Remarks on board Thursday April 7th 1851

First & Middle part fine breezes in the
N.W. steering by the wind to the North
Latter part light airs with pleasant weather
took off the fore sail and repaired it

Friday April 8th

Commences with light airs from West. At sun
down wind veered to S.W. and began to be-
ware. Middle part at 12 fresh breezes with
rain. At 2 P.M. wind veered to W.S.W. with
strong breezes. Latter part hard gales with
clear weather, laying under fore sail
and close reef main top sail

Latitude by Obs 27.48 N Long 179.00 E

Saturday April 9th

First part hard gales from N.W. steering
by S.W. Middle part at 8 took in the
fore sail wore ship and lay too headed
to the South. Latter part wind West wore
ship to the North set close reef top sails and
a reef fore sail. Lat 28.00 Long 178.50 E

Sunday April 10th

First part strong gales and squalls wind
veering gradually to the North. At sundown
wind S.W. wore ship to the N.W. Middle
part more moderate. Latter part fresh breezes
from S.W. set double reef top sails

Latitude by Obs 27.58 N Long by Ac 179.20 West

Monday April 11th

All these 24 hours strong gales from
North to S.W. steering by the wind to the
westward, under double reef top sails

Latitude by Obs 28.24 N Long by Ac 179.20 East

Tuesday April 12th

All these 24 hours hard gales from S.W. steer-
ing to the S.W. under a close reef main top
sail and spinnaker, on the latter part set
the fore sail

Latitude by Obs 29.25 Long 178.00 East

Remarks on board Wednesday April 13th

First part strong gales from S.W. with clear
weather. Middle part more moderate
Latter part moderate breezes from S.W. with
over cast weather, un bent the main top sail
and repaired it. Lat 30.30 N Long by Ac 178.30 E

Thursday April 14th

First part light breezes from S.W. steering
by S.W. Middle & Latter part light airs and
calm, saw porpoises and a shark

Latitude by Obs 30.25 N Longitude by Ac 177.10 East

Friday April 15th

All these 24 hours light airs and variable
with pleasant weather, steering a zig zag course
to the westward, saw grampuses and finbacks
Latitude by Obs 30.25 N Longitude by Ac 176.54 East

Saturday April 16th

First and Middle part light airs from the
East ward steering to the South. Latter part fresh
breezes from S.W. with cloudy weather steering
by the wind to the S.W. No signs of Whales
Latitude by Obs 30.05 North Longitude by Ac 176.15 E

Sunday April 17th

First and Middle part light breezes from South
with cloudy weather steering to the westward
Latter part moderate breezes from South and S.W.
with pleasant weather, saw finbacks

Latitude by Obs 29.58 N Longitude by Ac 175.15 East

Monday April 18th

First part light breezes from S.W. steering
by the wind to the Westward. At 6 P.M. wind
and shifted to the westward in a light squall
Middle part light breezes from S.W. to East
Latter part light breezes from East with
thick hazy weather, saw a great many
finbacks, and a great deal of red brim in the
water, the same kind that Right Whale
feed upon. the water has been very green
colour for two days past. Latitude 30.00 N
