

Remarks on Friday November 14th 1845

Commences with light breezes from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather steering to the E. with all sail set at 3 p.m. saw a sail heading to the westward. Middle part moderate latter part strong breezes from the west and pleasant steering to the E. with all sail set. Lat by Obs 33-52 N Long by Obs 42-09 W

Remarks on Saturday Nov 15th

Commences with strong breezes from the west and pleasant weather steering to the E. with studding sail low & abast. Middle part strong breeze latter part the wind hauled to the South saw nothing to day so ends. Lat by Obs 34-13 N Long by Obs 38-28 W

Remarks on Sunday Nov 16th

Came with light breezes from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather steering to the S.E. with all sail set. Middle part ditto latter part the wind hauled to the South East sharp by the E.E. and nothing to. Lat by Obs 33-53 N Long by Obs 38-13 W

Remarks on Monday Nov 17th

Came with light breezes from the South and fine pleasant weather heading sharp by the E.E. with all sail set. Middle part light breezes latter part ditto. Lat by Obs 34-09 N Long by Obs 33-45 W

Remarks on Tuesday Nov 18th

Came with light breezes from the S.W. and light squalls heading to the E.E. to S.E. saw 2 sails steering to the North & Eastward. Middle part light breezes and light squalls latter part ditto saw 3 sails steering to the N.E. so ends with rain and squalls. Lat by Obs 33-33 N Long by Obs 31-40 W

Remarks on Wednesday November 19th 1845

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. to W. and squally rainy weather heading sharp by the S.E. to S.E. at night 2 sails on the S.W. heading to the South. Middle part squally latter part winds from South to S.W. saw two sails. Lat by Obs 32-00 N Long by Obs 31-00 W

Remarks on Thursday Nov 20th 1845

Commences with light breezes from the W. and squally rainy weather heading to the S.E. with all sail set. Middle part light and calm latter part ditto day light saw two sails at 8 lowered the boats to exercise the crew. Lat by Obs 32-13 N Long by Obs 28-55 W

Remarks on Friday Nov 21st 1845

Commences with light and from the W. and fine pleasant weather heading sharply by the S.E. at 4 p.m. saw a ship lowered and caught him at night calm at 8 p.m. took light and from the E.E. Middle part ditto latter part strong winds from the S.E. attended with squalls. Lat by Obs 31-13 N Long by Obs 28-56 W Long by Obs 29-02 W

Remarks on Saturday Nov 22nd 1845

Commences with strong winds from the S.E. and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the S.W. at night took heavy squalls attended with rain one sail in sight latter part the winds about the same. Lat by Obs 29-00 N Long by Obs 29-25 W

Remarks on Sunday Nov 23rd

Commences with strong winds from the S.E. and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the S.W. one ship towardward heading to the South. Middle part heading to the S.W. latter part pleasant heading to the S.E. Lat by Obs 26-44 N Long by Obs 28-57 W Long by Obs 29-05 W
