

Remarks on Monday November 24<sup>th</sup> 1855

Commenced with strong Trades from the N.E. to E.S.E. and pleasant weather steering to the S.E. to S.W. with all sail set. Middle part equally latter part ditto. Attended with heavy squalls. At 10 a.m. set the course which the above ship & American Colours. Lat. 41° 26' N. Long. 74° 27' W.

Remarks on Tuesday Nov. 25<sup>th</sup>

Came with strong Trades from the East and equally weather steering to the S.W. with all sail set. The above ship & spouts kept the beam to leeward who we are sailing. Handled. Middle part strong winds and heavy squalls putted the Leache ropes of the Fore & Main top-sail. Lat. 41° 10' N. Long. 74° 30' W.

Remarks on Wednesday Nov. 26<sup>th</sup>

Came with strong winds from the East to E.S.E. and heavy squalls of rain. Employed in repairing the Mizen top-sail & at 4 double reefed it. Middle part equally latter part fine weather heading sharp by the S.W. Lat. 41° 15' N. Long. 74° 26' W.

Remarks on Thursday Nov. 27<sup>th</sup>

Came with light breezes from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the South with all sail set. Middle part strong breezes latter part ditto. Lat. 41° 15' N. Long. 74° 26' W.

Remarks on Friday Nov. 28<sup>th</sup>

Came with strong winds from the East and overcast weather steering to the South with all sail set. at 3 p.m. left to the West heading to the S.E. at 7 p.m. shifted off to the South. Middle part strong winds latter part light squalls and flying fish &c. Lat. 41° 23' N. Long. 74° 26' W.

Remarks on Saturday November 29<sup>th</sup> 1855

Commenced with strong Trades from the East and overcast steering to the S.E. & Middle part strong breezes and pleasant latter part pleasant with the wind more light. saw. saw fish &c. Lat. 41° 10' N. Long. 74° 24' W.

Remarks on Sunday Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> 1855

Commenced with moderate Trades from the N.E. to E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the S.E. with all sail set. Middle part strong breezes and pleasant latter part ditto with but weather S. ends. Lat. 41° 5' N. Long. 74° 22' W.

Remarks on Monday Nov. Dec.

Commenced with strong Trades from the East to N.E. and pleasant weather steering to the S.E. with all sail set at 3 p.m. saw a schooner ahead at 4 p.m. saw Black fish lowered but with no success at 5 spoke the above schooner did not understand her name from Mander's house to London. Middle part moderate latter part equally with rain. Lat. 41° 5' N. Long. 74° 22' W.

Remarks on Tuesday Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>

Commenced with light winds & Calms heading to the S.W. at 3 p.m. saw Black fish lowered but to Calm for to strike. Middle part light and calm latter part pleasant heading to the S.W. at 12 meridian spoke a ferreting dog did not understand his name outlandish. Lat. 41° 5' N. Long. 74° 23' W.

Remarks on Wednesday Dec. 2<sup>nd</sup>

Came with strong winds from the N.E. to South and fine weather heading sharp by the S.W. at night saw one sail steering to the S.E. Middle part strong winds latter part ditto at 7 a.m. took to the S.W. S. ends. Lat. 41° 5' N. Long. 74° 23' W.
