

Remarks on Wednesday December 24th 1845

Commences with light breeze from the S.W. and pleasant weather heading sharply by the west. Saw Grampus & turkeys like Porpoises and caught at night squally took in 4 gallons of water. Middle part little latter part into at 7 a.m. back to the S. Lat 46° 32' 42" S Long 46° 12' 10" W

Remarks on Thursday Dec 25

Come with strong winds from the S.W. to S.W. and squally weather heading sharp by the East at 4 p.m. tack to the S.W. Middle part light air and calm latter part at 4 a.m. tack to the S.E. per sail Lat 46° 32' 42" S Long 45° 52' 10" W

Remarks on Friday Dec 26

Commences with light breeze from S.W. and pleasant weather heading to the Eastward at 3 p.m. tack to the S.W. at night calm Middle part light air and calm latter part at daylight took light breeze from the N.E. steering to the S.W. with all sail at Lat 46° 33' 05" S Long 45° 46' 10" W

Remarks on Saturday Dec 27

Come with light breeze from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather steering to the S.W. all sail set. Middle fine breeze latter part strong winds from the north steering to the North with all sail set Lat 46° 35' 05" S Long 45° 47' 10" W

Remarks on Sunday Dec 28

Come with strong winds from the North and overcast steering to the S.W. at 3 p.m. the wind shifted to the west & increased with rain at night calm Middle part squally latter part little at 8 a.m. saw a large sperm whale at 9 p.m. landed but with no success saw the boat and went off to land at 11 p.m. Steered to the S.W. Lat 46° 36' 30" S Long 50° 00' 00" W

Remarks on Monday December 29th 1845

Commences with strong winds from the North and thick overcast steering to the S.W. with all sail set. Saw Porpoises and back Long, & Middle part squally with heavy rain and lightning latter more pleasant at 10 a.m. saw moderate breeze from the S.W. at 11 a.m. Lat 46° 37' 15" W

Remarks on Tuesday Dec 30th

Come with strong winds or gale from the N.W. and squally weather heading to the Southward double reef at 7 p.m. took heavy squalls with rain. Middle part little with lightning latter part more pleasant made sail heading to the west. Lat 46° 38' 43" S Long 46° 52' 20" W

Remarks on Wednesday Dec 31st

Come with strong winds from the South and squally weather at 4 tack to the S.E. Middle part strong winds latter part strong wind & squally at 10 more pleasant nothing in sight. Lat 46° 40' 05" S Long 46° 52' 53" W

Remarks on Thursday January 1st 1846

Commences with strong winds and squally heading sharp by the S.W. under double reef Middle part heavy squalls and thunder and lightning latter part more moderate Lat 46° 42' 14" S Long 46° 53' 23" W

Remarks on Friday Jan 2

Come with light breeze from the East and overcast steering to the S.W. with all sail set. Saw Right whale & Porpoises at night squally latter part little took in all sail latter part more moderate under all sail heading sharp by the S.W. Lat 46° 41' 59" S Long 46° 54' 39" W
