Commenced with light breeze from the N.W. and pleasant heading sharp by the N.E. at 4 pm Calm from the N.W. Middle part Calm latter part light breeze from the N.W. heading to the S.W. at 8 pm with all sail set and passengers and birds kept 8.

# Remarks on Sunday Jan 4<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong winds from the N.W. and squally rainy weather steering to the N.W. at 4 am the wind hauled to the west heading sharp by the N.W. Middle part strong winds & squally heading S.W. latter part the wind hauled to the North at 8 am took heavy squalls attended with rain at 9. Close reef the topsails with a heavy Gale from the S.W. to South at 12 meridian hove to under storm sail. Lat by Obs 43.10.1  
Long by Obs 57.20.11

# Remarks on Monday Jan 5<sup>th</sup>

Came with a very heavy Gale from the S.W. and squally and with a very heavy sea on heading to the N.W. at 4 meridian ship to the East. at 5 pm the gale abated a little Middle part ditto latter part at 8 am set 3 reefs topsails reef course at 12 made all sail heading to the E.S.E. Lat by Obs 42.30.1  
Long by Obs 57.25.11

# Remarks on Tuesday Jan 6<sup>th</sup>

Came with the light breeze from the South and overcast heading sharp by the E.S.E. with all sail on and with a very heavy sea & running from the South saw 2 large whale birds 8. at night Calm Middle part light airs and calm latter part took a light breeze from the North steering to the South at 12 Calm.

# Remarks on Wednesday January 7<sup>th</sup> 1845

Commenced with light airs and Calm heading to the S.W. at 4 took light squalls of rain Middle part light airs latter part at 5 am took light breeze from the North steering to the South Lat by Obs 42.30.1  
Long by Obs 57.19.11

# Remarks on Thursday Jan 8<sup>th</sup> 1845

Commenced with strong winds from the N.W. and over east steering to the S.W. under double reef at night the wind hauled to the west and more moderate Middle part Calm latter part the wind sprung up from the S.W. at 10 am increased to a heavy Gale laying to under short sail.

# Remarks on Friday Jan 9<sup>th</sup> 1845

Came with a heavy Gale from the S.W. heading to the S.E. under storm sail at 6 am moderate made more sail Middle part a heavy sea & running from the South latter at day light made all sail heading to the N.E. at 8 am Calm at 10 took a light breeze from the North steering to the S.W. Lat by Obs 47.15.1  
Long by Obs 57.38.11

# Remarks on Saturday Jan 10<sup>th</sup>

Came with moderate breeze from the N.W. and pleasant weather heading sharp by the S.W. to South at 6 pm saw two light whales going. Eyes out towards land lowered but with no success. Middle part strong winds latter part ditto heading sharp by the N.E. at 10 am saw a Ship heading to the South Lat by Obs 48.56.1  
Long by Obs 57.38.11

# Remarks on Sunday Jan 11<sup>th</sup>

Came with strong breeze from the N.W. and pleasant heading sharp by the S.W. saw porpoise for back to Middle part heading to the S.E. latter part ditto saw fin backs Lat by Obs 50.44.1
