Islands S.W. Dist of Estimation 60 miles Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.50-48.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.57-20.00 W.

Remarks on Tuesday Jan 13

Commenced with light breeze from the N.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the S.E. with all sail on at 4 p.m. saw a ship heading to the North at night the land Dist 5 leagues at night steered S.E. Middle part ditto latter part at day light steered South with the land in sight Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.52-25.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.58-21.00 W.

Remarks on Wednesday Jan 14

Commenced with strong winds from the North and overcast at 1 p.m. steered to the N.W. with all sail set at 4 p.m. took light squalls of rain at night thick Middle part squally at times with rain latter at 4 p.m. the wind knocked her to the S.E. at 4 p.m. tack to the S.W. at 10 made all sail Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.53-47.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.60-12.00 W.

Remarks on Thursday Jan 15

Commenced with light breeze from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the S.W. with all sail on at 2 p.m. saw a great number of Finback that there sperm whales being so great in number at night calm Middle part ditto latter part at 6 a.m. took a light breeze from the N.W. heading to the S.W. saw great number of Finbacks porpoise. Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.54-13.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.61-09.00 W.

Remarks on Friday January 15<sup>th</sup> 1845

Commenced with light breeze from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather heading sharp by the S.W. saw Finbacks & at 7 p.m. saw Staten Land. Middle part calm latter part at 6 p.m.

Remarks on Saturday Jan 16<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with light air from the S.W. and pleasant weather heading to the South at 2 p.m. saw a ship from Amoy Janett 30 months out 3900 lbs bound home port latter at 6 p.m. mast full heading to the S.E. Middle part strong winds & squally latter more moderate at 7 a.m. tack to the S.W. at 12 saw a bark ship heading to the S.E. saw porpoise & at 12 made all sail Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.55-00.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.61-58.00 W.

Remarks on Sunday January 17<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with light breeze from the S.E. and pleasant weather heading to the N.W. at 1 p.m. tack to the S.E. at 4 heading to the S.W. Middle part calm latter part light breeze from the N.W. steering S.W. Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.57-14.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.62-32.00 W.

Remarks on Monday January 18<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with light winds from the N.W. and overcast heading sharp by the N.W. at 1 p.m. knock of to the South saw land toward heading to the South Middle part strong wind & squally latter part at 7 a.m. tack to the N.W. saw porpoise. Lat<sup>y</sup> 46.58-14.00 S. Long<sup>y</sup> 140.65-00.00 W.
