

Remarks On Friday January 30th 1846

Encounters with moderate
breezes from the South and overcast weather
steering to the N. W. with all sail set. Steadying
set fair & about at 3 P.M. saw a ship steering to the N. E.
Headed past strong winds latter part strong winds
from the N. E. Steering with our sails. Lat 46.52.20.

Remarks On Saturday Jan^y 31st Long 4

Commenced with moderate breeze from the S.E. and overcast. Steering to the North with all sail set 1 mile in sight a head Middle part steering ditto latter more moderate saw great number of Porpoises Middle part moderate latter ditto at 4 m ~~saw~~ caught 5 porpoises 1 mile in sight Lat. 44° 49' 40" S.

Remarks on Sunday, February, 18th Long's

Home with light breeze from
 the South and fine pleasant weather steering to the North
 saw Kerpain Embark to Middleport moderate latter Gite
 at 7 a.m. Spoke the ship Scotland of Star track & 3 months
 out 3 lbs of sperm steering to the Northern company South by 44. 42. 42.

Remarks on Monday Feb 27th 1845

Coming with light breeze from the South and pleasant weather. Steering to the North with all sail on in company with the American ship at 1 1/2 p.m. Saw eight whales lowered in company the American ship boat struck and I killed at 5 p.m. took him to their ship, at 5 1/2 p.m. our two boats lowered struck 1 killed at 6 p.m. took him to the ship. Middle part lying by the whale Latter part at 7 o'clock cutting at 10 p.m. finished and made sail at 11 p.m. more whales towardward so End

Remarks on Tuesday February 21st 1866

Commences with moderate
breezes from the South and fine pleasant weather set in
pursuit of whales at 1 1/2 PM lowered but the bomb boat gathered
the whales and off they went. Middle part of day little gain.
At 4 PM lowered again of North at 9 PM saw 2 right whales
at 10 lowered. Struck 1 killed it took him to
the Ship and made ready for to cut. Lat 42.25 S.

Remarks on Wednesday Feb. 28. 1845

Come with strong wind from the South and ruzzed at 2pm come cutting at 5 finished at 5 1/2 saw 3 whales lowered 2 boats struck 2 whales the lines got a foul and parted them both and off went the whale at night took in Lail Madole put Bailing Latter ditto at 9 a m saw 6 seals of Shipp 4 of them a bailing at 9 a m Spoke the Ship Station of New Bedford 3 1/2 months out 50 lbs of Sperm oil at 10 put Double pump to pump La H 1/2 lbs 17. 15 P

Remarks on Thursday Feb 5

Coming with strong winds from the South and squally rugged weather at 1 p.m. kept up to the N.W. blowing. Middle part ditto latter at 3 cleared to the N.E. with rugged weather. Left by abt 5.50 a.m.

Remarks on Friday Feb 6th

Commenced with strong winds
from the South and Squally rugged weather. Steering
to the N.E. Boiling at 2 P.M. saw 4 sail at 3 P.M. the
Ship Sava of New Bedford 500 tons the rest 4 right Whales Mardell
part Squally & rugged Latter part little sun. jibsacks &c.
Lat by obs. 42. 39 N.
Long by Chron. 60. 05 W
