

Remarks on Wednesday Feb 15th 1846

Commenced with light air breeze from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. with all sail set. Middle part moderate latter part calm fine weather. Lat 19° 59' S. Long 151° 50' W.

Remarks on Thursday Feb 16th

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. with all sail set. Middle part strong trades latter part more moderate. Nothing in sight. Lat 17° 23' S. Long 152° 50' W.

Remarks on Friday Feb 20th

Came with moderate trades from the S.E. and overcast steering to the N.W. with all sail set. Middle part moderate latter part little steering to the N.W. Lat 15° 11' S. Long 154° 03' W.

Remarks on Saturday Feb 21st

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. saw porpoises & birds. Lat 13° 23' S. Long 154° 46' W.

Remarks on Sunday Feb 22nd

Came with moderate trades from the S.E. and fine weather steering to the N.W. at 5 pm saw a school of black fish & Middle part moderate latter part calm fine black fish. Lat 11° 31' S. Long 155° 50' W.

Remarks on Monday Feb 23rd

Came with moderate trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. saw black fish and caught 1. Middle part moderate latter part calm and hot weather. Lat 9° 51' S. Long 156° 51' W.

Remarks on Tuesday February 24th 1846

Commenced with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. with all sail set. Saw Grampasses & Middle part moderate latter part calm fine pleasant weather. Lat 6° 06' S. Long 157° 50' W.

Remarks on Wednesday Feb 25th

Came with light trades from the S.E. and pleasant weather steering to the N.W. with all sail set. Saw black fish & Middle part pleasant latter part calm fine black fish & Lat 5° 03' S. Long 158° 45' W.

Remarks on Thursday Feb 25th

Came with fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. Employed in fitting rigging. Middle part light air latter part little with squalls of rain saw fish but no whales. Lat 4° 23' S. Long 159° 25' W.

Remarks on Friday Feb 27th

Commenced with light trades from the N.E. to S.E. and squally weather with rain steering N.W. Middle part moderate latter part light air & hot weather. Lat 02° 41' S. Long 159° 54' W.

Remarks on Saturday 28th 1846

Commenced with light air from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. Middle part at 12 midnight took in studding sail and hoisted back latter part at 5 am kept up to the N.W. at 5 pm the South Head bearing N.W. Dist 6 Leagues saw black fish landed but with no success at 12 P.M. had her N.W. Dist 5 Leagues.

Remarks on Sunday March 1st 1846

Came with light trades and hot weather steering to the S.W. saw black fish & Middle part light air and calm latter part light air & calm steering to the S.W. Lat 3° 24' S. Long 161° 54' W.
