

Remarks on Saturday April 18th 1846

Commences with light
airs and calms heading to the west. Middle part
heavy rain. Latter more pleasant at 7 took a light
breeze from the west heading sharp by the NW one
sail in site. Lat 20° 33' N
Long 154° 21' W

Remarks on Sunday April 19th

Commences with moderate
breezes from the NW to North and pleasant weather
heading sharp by the NW at 4 p.m. saw the S of
Cape Lee bearing SW by W Dist 40 miles at 5 p.m. saw
the S of Moore bearing W by S Dist 35 miles two sail in
site Middle part strong winds running towards the
Passage Latter part at 8 off the Passage. Moon S.P.

Remarks on Monday April 20th

Commences with light
air & calm steering towards the Anacorage in
company with 4 ships at 2 p.m. come to anchor in Moon
roule in 33 fathoms of water. Moon S.P.

Remarks on Tuesday April 21st

Commences with light air from
the S.W. at 2 p.m. took one anchor and steered down
the passage bound to Alton for Kings Middle part
strong trade. Latter part at 1 a.m. off the west point of
moahoe at 10 a.m. saw Alton bearing W by N Dist 100 leagues.

Remarks on Wednesday April 22nd

Commences with strong trades from
the E. and S.W. and squally rugged weather steering down the
Land at 4 p.m. hove to back and took in sail heading off
& on for the Strait. Middle part bying off & on Latter
at 8 I went on shore for to procure some hogs two sails
in site. Lat Alton.

Remarks on Sunday April 19th 1846

Commences with strong
winds from the NE and squally rugged weather sail lay off
& on at 3 p.m. I come on board with 20 hogs & 2 dogs. Fruit potatoes
& at 5 p.m. steered down the passage bound to the North at night.
Middle part strong winds & heavy squalls Latter part little
little heading sharp by the North under double reef. Lat 20° 33' N
Long 160° 05' W

Remarks on Monday April 20th

Commences with strong trade and
heavy squalls heading sharp by the N.W. under double reef.
Middle part strong winds & squally Latter part more
moderate made sail. Lat 25° 52' N
Long 160° 11' W

Remarks on Tuesday April 21st

Commences with strong
wind from the NE and squally rugged weather
heading sharp by the N.W. Middle part strong winds
and squally Latter part more moderate. Lat 25° 00' N
Long 160° 33' W

Remarks on Wednesday April 22nd

Commences with strong breezes
from the NE to East and overcast weather steering to the
N.E. Middle part squally Latter part light air and
squally steering to the N.E. Lat 29° 50' N
Long 160° 40' W

Remarks on Thursday April 23rd

Commences with light breezes from the
East and overcast weather steering to the N.E. with all
sail set at 10 p.m. calm Middle part calm Latter part
at 11 a.m. took a light breeze from the North heading
sharp by the East saw some whale back. Lat 30° 47' N
Long 160° 45' W
