Commenced with light breeze from the North and overcast weather heading sharp by the E. & N. at 3 p.m. tack to the N. & W. Middle part Calm. Latter part ditto saw 1 Sail and a lot of Spruce & Mast &c.

Remarks on Saturday April 25th

Commenced with light air & Calm heading to the North & sail in situ. Middle part Calm. Latter part light air from the N.E. at 8 a.m. Spoke the Ship William Huntington New Bedford at 10 took light air from the South.

Longth by Obs 161.19 W.

Remarks on Sunday 26th

Commenced with light air from the South and fine pleasant weather steering to the North in company with the above men ship. Middle part Almost calm. Latter part Light air & Calm.

Remarks on Monday April 27th

Commenced with light air & Calm heading to the North in company with the above ship. Middle part the wind all around. Latter part took strong wind from the N.W. to North attended with rain & fog. at 9 saw another sail on the quarter.

Longth by Obs 159.45 W.

Remarks on Tuesday April 28th

Commenced with strong winds from the N.W. and squally weather heading sharp by the N.E. & 2 sail in situ. Middle part strong wind and squally. Latter part at 8 a.m. tack to the N.W. at 10 almost calm.

Lat^{ty} by Obs 34.05 N.

Longth by Obs 159.30 W.

Remarks on Wednesday April 29th 1846

Commenced with light breeze from the N.W. and overcast heading sharp by the N.W. at night calm. Middle part ditto. Latter part at 5 a.m. took light air from the N.W. and pleasant. Lat^{ty} in 34.30 N.

Longth by Obs 159.02 W.

Remarks on Thursday April 30th

Commenced with light breeze from the S.W. and overcast steering to the North with all sail set. Middle part fine breeze. Latter ditto saw white birds & at 10 inclining to rain.

Lat^{ty} by Obs 37.19 N.

Longth by Obs 158.51 W.

Remarks on Friday May 1st 1846

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. and rainy weather steering to the North with all sail set. at 7 p.m. the wind halled to the West and cleared up at 8 double reef. Middle part strong winds. Latter the wind halled of to the E. & E.

Lat^{ty} by Obs 39.06 N.

Longth by Obs 158.20 W.

Remarks on Saturday May 2nd

Commenced with light air & pleasant heading to the East at 1 p.m. tack to the N.W. at 3 p.m. saw a sail towards at night took light air from the S.E. Middle part light breeze. Latter took strong winds from the South steering N.E. at 5 a.m. saw a ship steering to the North at 7 p.m. her maneuvering and saw two Right Whales going quick to windward at 8 steered of to the N.E. & E.

Lat^{ty} by Obs 40.11 N.

Longth by Obs 156.43 W.

Remarks on Sunday May 3rd

Commenced with strong winds from the South and overcast steering to the N.E. at 2 p.m. steered to the N.W. one sail in situ. Middle part the wind halled to the West attended with rain. Latter part more pleasant at 12 double reef the topsails.
