

Remarks on Monday May 4th 1846.

Commenced with strong winds from the West and cold rugged weather heading sharp by the N.W. under double reef. at 9 a.m. took heavy squalls Middle part. blowing a gale. Latter part ditto attended with heavy sea. Lat 44.50 N. Long 156.20 W.

Remarks on Tuesday May 5th

Commenced with a Gale from the N.W. and squally rainy weather steering to the N.W. by compass under close reef. Middle part. Strong winds and foggy. Latter part more moderate made all sail and whale. Lat 44.10 N. Long 156.12 W.

Remarks on Wednesday May 6th

Came with strong breeze from the N.W. and foggy weather steering to the North at 2 p.m. cleared of pleasant but no whales. Middle part strong winds & squally. Latter part ditto running under double reef. topsails with a heavy sea. Lat 44.45 N. Long 155.20 W.

Remarks on Thursday May 7th

Came with strong winds and squally steering to the N.W. attended with snow squalls and hail at 4 p.m. Light to and too high for. Mayen topsails Middle part strong winds & squally. Latter part. at 5 a.m. kept of the above course. Lat 45.20 N. Long 156.45 W.

Remarks on Friday May 8th

Came with moderate breeze from the South and squally attended with hail. Middle part ditto. Latter part at 8 a.m. saw light whales at. at 11 p.m. lowered and chased at 12 came on board. Lat 52.56 N. Long 157.06

Remarks on Saturday May 9th 1846

Came with light breeze and squally attended with hail. Employed in chase of whales at 4 p.m. struck one killed and sunk him at night came on board whales in site Middle part moderate. Latter part light air & calm at 8 a.m. saw light whales. Lowered but with no success. Mayen top sails. Lat 44.52.57 N. Long 157.09 W.

Remarks on Sunday May 10th

Commenced with light air & calm. heading to the South still in chase of whales with the little chance very small at night took in sail steering to the S.E. Middle part ditto. Latter part at 5 a.m. saw light whales & 1 ship sailing at 6 a.m. lowered at 7 struck 1 and he took the line & went off towards ward. Lat 45.28 N. Long 157.00 W.

Remarks on Monday May 11th

Commenced with strong winds from the North and foggy weather at 1 p.m. lowered & hoisted at 4 p.m. spoke the ship Elizabeth of Salem 1 whale this season at night foggy. Middle part ditto. Latter part foggy at 8 p.m. a light whale lowered. Struck and drew the Dross at 11 saw more whale towards ward. Eng. in chase. Lat 45.25 N. Long 157.67 W.

Remarks on Tuesday May 12th

Came with strong winds from North and squally rugged weather still plying to seaward for whale at 4 p.m. lowered with no success at night the wind increased to a Gale. Middle part strong gale and rain & fog. Latter part ditto at 10 m.m. moderate at 11 a.m. saw two light whales. Set double reef topsails at 12 calm & fog and a heavy sea. Lat 45.40 N. Long 156.55 W.
