

Remarks on Sunday May 31st 1846

Came with strong winds from the SW and pleasant weather at 2 p.m. took the whale to the ship at 5 o'clock. Latter part of the day the weather was very much changed at 4 a.m. spoke a storming sea. Ship could not under stand her name at 9 the wind increased to a heavy Gale took in all sail & hove to. Middle part strong gale & heavy sea. Latter at 4 a.m. hove ship to the NE at 6 more moderate set the work a going with sculls of blubber in the blubber room. Lat. 53.15 N. Long. 154.21 W.

Remarks on Monday June 1st

Came with strong winds from the SE to SW and squally rugged weather heading to the westward under short sail. Middle part ditto. Latter sailing and rugged weather.

Remarks on Tuesday June 2nd

Came with strong winds from the South and rugged weather heading to the west under short sail. Sailing. Middle part ditto. Latter part more moderate. Lat. 53.21 N. Long. 155.46 W.

Remarks on Wednesday June 3rd

Came with light breeze from the North and pleasant weather steering to the South with all under short sail. Sailing. Middle part ditto. Latter part. Stowing down in the Main hold. Lat. 52.39 N. Long. 155.33 W.

Remarks on Thursday June 4th

Came with light air from the West and pleasant. Engaged in sailing & stowing down at 3 p.m. spoke the Ship Dover of New London 300 tons. At 5 spoke the Ship Huntress of New Bedford 1 whale. Middle part heading south. Latter at 8 a.m. saw whales. Lowered without success. Lat. 51.40 N. Long. 155.20 W.

Remarks on Friday June 5th 1846

Came with strong winds from the West and rugged weather heading to North. At 2 saw whale. Lowered but could not strike. Middle part heavy gale. Lying to under storm sails. Latter at 7 hove ship to the South with a heavy gale and rugged. Lat. 51.17 N. Long. 154.50 W.

Remarks on Saturday June 6th

Came with strong winds and rugged weather. Employed in stowing down. Middle part strong winds. Latter part the wind increased to a heavy gale at 10 finished stowing. Lat. 51.30 N. Long. 155.10 W.

Remarks on Sunday June 7th

Came with strong gale from the westward & rugged heading to the South under short sail. Middle part ditto. Latter part at day light saw whale. Lowered & hoisted. Whales very wild. Lat. 51.18 N. Long. 154.20 W.

Remarks on Monday June 8th

Came with a strong wind from the East heading to the North at 4 hove to under close reef. Main top sail. Middle part ditto. Latter more moderate. Set double reef with a heavy sea on. Lat. 51.40 N. Long. 154.00 W.

Remarks on Tuesday June 9th

Came with strong winds from the West and rugged rainy weather steering to the East at 4 p.m. hove to with a heavy gale. Middle part ditto. Latter part more moderate. Lat. 52.50 N. Long. 153.40 W.

Remarks on Wednesday June 10th

Came with a Gale from the West heading to the North under short sail. Middle part ditto. Latter part rugged weather. An angry and no mistake. Lat. 53.20 N. Long. 152.20 W.
