

Remarks on Thursday June 11th 1845.

Come with strong Gale from the West heading to the South under short sail at 3.20 the Fore sail 1 mile a mile Middle part rugged latter part more moderate set double reef at 8 saw whale Lowered without success Lat 46.52.24 N Long 153.30 W

Remarks on Friday June 12

Come with moderate breeze from the west heading to the wind to the South at 3 back to the North at 5 p.m. saw 4 whales lowered struck 1 and he took the Line Bow boat struck again and the first Iron drew & cut the line and the whale went off at dark Come on board Middle part. Calm latter part Calm at 7 saw whale lowered could not get on being Calm Lat 46.52.34 N Long 153.30 W

Remarks on Saturday June 13

Come with light air from the west and pleasant Steering to the East at 8 p.m. saw whale lowered at 8 struck one killed him at 8 took him to the Ship Middle part tying by the whale latter at 5 Come Cutting at 12 finished it Lat 46.52.17 N Long 153.00 W

Remarks on Sunday June 14

Come with light breeze from the west and over cast heading to the North at 7 p.m. Spoke the Ship Archer of New Bedford Nothing this season Middle part backing latter part little at 10 a.m. spoke the Ship Golconda New Bedford 3 whales this season so ends with fog Lat 46.52.12 N Long 152.20 W

Remarks on Monday June 15th 1845

Come with light breeze from west and foggy weather Steering to the South backing at 3 p.m. saw right whale lowered without success Middle part backing latter little at 6 a.m. saw whale at 8 lowered at 8 struck 1 killed him and took him to the ship holding him up the Loger head flew out and struck one of the men with great force the back part of the head which hurt him very bad took him on board and killed him 8 Lat 46.52.20 N Long 153.09 W

Remarks on Tuesday June 16th

Come with light wind from the North Steering barrens courses backing the above man come to a little at 3 p.m. spoke the Ship Cabinet Middle part backing latter part Steering to the N. at 11 a.m. spoke the Ship Timmy and 3 whales at 11 p.m. right whale in pursuit Lat 46.52.08 N Long 154.42 W

Remarks on Wednesday June 17

Come with light wind still in pursuit of the above whales at 2 p.m. lowered & the boat killed the whale and off they went come on board and Come Steaming down Middle part Calm latter at day light strong winds and rugged saw whale Lat 46.51.11 N Long 154.10 W

Remarks on Thursday June 18th

Come with strong winds from the west heading to the South under short sail at 4 p.m. saw 1 whale lowered without success Middle part rugged latter part Lying to under short sail Lat 46.51.30 N Long 154.00 W
