

Remarks on Friday June 19th 1840.

Came with strong winds from the South heading to the North with foggy weather at 4 p.m. saw a dead whale towardward at 4 p.m. saw 2 live whales at 5 lowered struck one killed at 7 p.m. took him to the ship. After being shot upon the fog & hours Meddell lay by the whale latter part thick fog & rain at 6 p.m. commenced cutting at 12 finished & came bailing Lat 51.30 N. Long 154.50 W.

Remarks on Saturday June 20th

Came with light winds from the North. Came in bailing at 3 p.m. saw a bark ship. Meddell part foggy latter part at 4 p.m. saw whales lowered without success Lat 51.40 N. Long 155.00 W.

Remarks on Sunday June 21st

Came with strong Gale from the West. Lay to under short sail at 5 p.m. cooled down and furled the Fore sail. Meddell part heavy Gale latter part at 4 came bailing with fog & Lat 51.30 N. Long 156.00 W.

Remarks on Monday June 22nd

Came with strong Gale from the West and foggy weather heading to the South bailing Meddell part ditto latter part at 7 finished bailing and commence heaving out Lat 52.00 N. Long 155.50 W.

Remarks on Tuesday June 23rd

Came with strong Gales from the South and and thick weather at 4 saw whales lowered and hoisted & came in stormy dawn Meddell & latter part busy storm & sail in site Lat 52.10 N. Long 156.51 W.

Remarks on Wednesday June 24th 1840

Came with strong winds from East and rugged weather came in stormy dawn at 5 finished at 7 p.m. saw whales lowered struck 1 round towardward. At the time Meddell lay to under short sail latter part more pleasant part of Gale and whales Lat 51.50 N. Long 155.50 W.

Remarks on Thursday June 25th

Commenced with light breeze from the N.E. and overcast heading to the N.W. at 3 p.m. foggy Meddell part the wind from North steering to the South at 6 a.m. spoke the ship Sarah Barker of Amherst. At this time saw a Ende with thick fog some further. Lat 50.55 N. Long 155.30 W.

Remarks on Friday June 26th

Came with light breeze from the N. and thick foggy weather at 2 p.m. spoke the ship Edward of New Bedford 2 whales Meddell part foggy latter part more pleasant steered to the N.W. saw further & 1 ship in site had weather 4 men of duty Lat 50.25 N. Long 156.20 W.

Remarks on Saturday June 27th

Came with light winds from the North & East and foggy heading to the Westward Meddell part ditto latter part more clear at 4 a.m. saw 1 light whale lowered struck killed at 9 took him to the ship and came cutting to Ende with fog Lat 50.10 N. Long 155.30 W.

Remarks on Sunday June 28th

Came with strong breezes and squalls with fog lay cutting at 3 p.m. finished at 4 saw more whales lowered struck 1 killed him at 6 p.m. took him to the ship Meddell part lay by the whale latter at 7 p.m. came bailing with a rugged time of it Lat 49.50 N. Long 155.10 W.
