Came with strong wind from West. Emp. in cutting at 3 p.m. finished and made a short haul Middle part hauling Latter part ditto at 9 a.m. saw more whale landed at 10 struck and the 3 were back & the rest were off. ~~at 11 a.m. saw 1 whale~~

Remarks on Tuesday June 30th

Came with light winds from the East. and pleasant. heading to the North saw 1 sail maneuvering Middle part hauling Latter part ditto at 6 a.m. the wind increased to a gale attended with fog & rain.

Remarks on Wednesday July 1st

Came with light winds from the Westward. Hearing barrels, course in hauling Middle part rigged & foggy Latter increasing to a gale 4 men sick as usual.

Came with light winds all around the compass. Employed in stowing down and hauling Middle part hauling Latter part ditto Latter by Chr 49.40

Remarks on Friday July 3rd

Came with light winds from the South steering to the N.W. Employed in stowing down in the main. Whistle away at 3 p.m. saw 1 right whale. Landed. did not strike on the account of fog. Middle part thick fog Latter part. Strong Gale & fog Latter by Chr 49.500

Remarks on Saturday July 4th 1866.

Came with strong winds from N.W. and thick foggy weather heading to the North. Middle part ditto Latter part at 9 a.m. heard ship to the N.W. with a very heavy sea rolling from the West. Middle part Latter by Chr 50.300

Remarks on Sunday July 5th

Came with strong Gale from the West and thick foggy weather heading to the South. Middle part hauling Latter part at 9 heard ship to the N.W. at 9 a.m. saw a sail at 12 spoke the ship Milton New Bedford 5 whale thereason Latter by Chr 50.280

Remarks on Monday July 6th

Commenced with strong breeze from the West. and over cast heading to the N.W. saw 1 right whale at 9 p.m. saw two Right whales going quick to the West. Middle part heading to the N.W. Latter part at 6 a.m. tack to the S.W. at 9 a.m. saw 1 whale at 10 Landed without success saw 4 ship 2 of them maneuvering Latter by Chr 50.480

Long by Chr 156.500

Remarks on Tuesday July 7th

Came with a light breeze from the West and fine pleasant weather heading to the S.W. saw nothing 3 men sick Middle part moderate Latter part at 7 tack to the N.W. saw nothing Latter by Chr 50.300

Remarks on Wednesday July 8th

Came with strong breeze from the N.W. and over cast weather heading to the N.W. at 4 p.m. spoke the ship Henry Kneeland 2 whales at night the hauled to the South and increased to a gale with rain & fog. Middle part strong gale and heavy sea on Latter part ditto at 8 a.m. tack to the S.W. Latter by Chr 50.450
