

Remarks on Saturday July 18<sup>th</sup> 1846

Comes with strong winds from the west and rugged weather at 4 o'clock commence cutting rock in the throat & Lips and at night knock off heavy bay rugged and one of the joggles. The latter part of the day the whale latter part at 7 o'clock cutting running before the wind all sail in at 10 took in the head & Latt by Sec 50.40 N. Long by Sec 151.30 W.

Remarks on Sunday July 19<sup>th</sup>

Comes with a gale from the west and squally rugged weather Emp in cutting at 2 1/2 pm finished and left to a fair a rough time of it and no mistake. Middle part boiling. Latter part ditto at 10 a m saw 1 right whale lowered without success. Latt by Sec 50.55 N. Long by Sec 151.10 W.

Remarks on Monday July 20<sup>th</sup>

Comes with strong winds from the west and squally rugged weather at 3 pm spoke the ship Governor troop of New Bedford 7 whales or 360 lbs. Middle part boiling. Latter part fog at 10 a m cleared up a little at 10 1/2 pm saw 1 right whale lowered struck and the whale run and the line got a foul so cut the line and come on board. Latt by Sec 50.45 N. Long by Sec 150.45 W.

Remarks on Tuesday July 21<sup>st</sup>

Comes with strong winds from the west at 10 a m saw another whale lowered at 4 struck and the whale run back to windward at 4 1/2 but the line after being 15 miles from the ship. Middle part boiling. Latter part ditto saw 5 ships at 11 a m 1 right whale and saw the ship Milton got on. Latt by Sec 51.00 N. Long by Sec 150.32 W.

Remarks on Wednesday July 22<sup>nd</sup> 1846

Comes with light wind from the west and foggy at 1 pm toward for the whole but without any success at 5 pm spoke the ship Alfred Taylor 3 whales at 7 pm spoke the ship Thomas Dyer 10 whales Middle part boiling at 12 finished boiling latter part fog saw 5 ships but no whales Emp in stowing down. Latt by Sec 50.41 N. Long by Sec 150.40 W.

Remarks on Thursday July 23<sup>rd</sup>

Comes with light breeze from the west and squales off fog heading to the NW Emp in stowing down at night the wind hauled to the South beared ship to the East. Middle part light breeze. Latter ditto with light fog Emp in stowing down saw 1 carcass & 3 ships. Latt by Sec 50.57 N. Long by Sec 149.21 W.

Remarks on Friday July 24<sup>th</sup>

Comes with light breeze from the NE and pleasant heading to the East. Emp in stowing down at 3 pm finished & saw another carcass and 1 ship. Mammery and boats fast at night took in sail Middle part foggy. Latter part ditto with rain heading ESE. Latt by Sec 50.50 N. Long by Sec 147.50 W.

Remarks on Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup>

Comes with moderate breeze from the NW and foggy raining weather heading to the NW with all sail set to gain to the west. Middle part thick fog with rain. Latter part ditto at 9 double reef at 10 took to the South saw nothing at 12 more clear saw 4. Latt by Sec 52.12 N. Long by Sec 150.11 W.

Remarks on Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup>

Comes with strong winds from the NE and thick overcast weather saw 4 humpbacks and a greater number of seals 1 piece of which Lewis & Middle part light air. Latter part ditto heading to the NW at 8 a m beared to the ESE saw greater number of humpback humpbacks. Latt by Sec 51.56 N. Long by Sec 149.47 W.
