

Remarks on Saturday October 24th 1845

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. and squally overcast weather steering to the E.S. with all sail set at 4 p.m. the wind hauled to the South Middle part strong winds Latter part ditto going on with the top. Lat 43. 11. 11. Long 95. 57. 11.

Remarks on Sunday Oct 25

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. and squally steering to the E.S. at 4 p.m. the wind hauled to the South with heavy squalls Middle part strong winds Latter more moderate at 5 the wind hauled to the west Lat 43. 25. 1. Long 95. 00. 11.

Remarks on Monday Oct 25

Commenced with strong winds from the W. and thick rainy weather steering to the E.S. Middle part strong winds & squally Latter part ditto at 7 the wind hauled to the S.W. Lat 43. 05. 1. Long 91. 30. 11.

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 27th

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. to S. and heavy squalls steering to the East under double reef at 2 p.m. saw a sail of the Quaker at 6 p.m. spoke the ship Rutosoff. New Bedford bound to Chik. Middle part strong winds and heavy squalls Latter part more moderate at 7 made more sail. Lat 42. 50. 1. Long 85. 50. 11.

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 28

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. to W. and squally rugged weather steering to the E.S. with all sail set going 10 knots in company with the Abou Mena ship. Middle part squally Latter part heavy squalls with hail and rain. Lat 46. 05. 1. Long 81. 51. 11.

Remarks on Thursday October 29th 1845

Commenced with strong winds from the S.W. to S. and squally rugged weather steering to the East at 4 saw two finbacks Middle part light breeze Latter part ditto the wind from the S.W. hauled to the E.S. at 10 calm. Lat 46. 01. 1. Long 86. 20. 11.

Remarks on Friday Oct 30th

Commenced with light air & calm heading to the E.S. at 4 took a light breeze from the W. at 5 p.m. saw a ship steering to the North at night steering to the E.S. at 10 p.m. spoke the ship Academonia of Torrington 1 right whale 3 female none out got some paper & at 11 saw a right whale lower without success Lat 46. 00. 1. Long 84. 50. 11.

Remarks on Saturday Oct 31st

Came with light air & calm heading to the South at 6 p.m. saw 1 right whale lower and galled him at 6 p.m. on board Middle part calm Latter took a light breeze from the S.W. steering in to the East saw 1 whale going quick Lat 46. 30. 1. Long 84. 00. 11.

Remarks on Sunday November 1st

Came with light breeze from all around heading to the E.S. at 3 p.m. saw two right whales at 4 lowered without success at night took in sail Middle part strong Gale Latter part ditto with heavy squalls at 8 more moderate at 11 saw a ship at 12 spoke the Sigeen Bay 11bb 1 whale this season came on board and took dinner. Lat 46. 13. 1. Long 84. 00. 11.

Remarks on Monday Nov 2nd

Came with strong winds from the west steering to the East at 5 left to heading to the S.W. Middle part heavy squalls Latter part ditto one sail in sail in sight to leeward. Lat 44. 13. 1. Long 85. 40. 11.
