

Remarks on Tuesday November 3rd 1850

Commenced with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. at 4 p.m. spoke the ship John Adams from New York at 5 p.m. at night took in sail and heaved ship to the N.W. Middle part strong wind and squally. Latter part ditto. Lat 46.46.52 Long 76.55.00

Remarks on Wednesday Nov 4th

Came with strong wind and squally heading to the North at 2 took to the N.W. Middle part heading ditto Latter light air and foggy heading to the N.W. saw fin back & 1 sail in site Lat 46.46.36.8 Long 76.00.00

Remarks on Thursday Nov 5th

Came with light breeze from the N.W. and foggy weather heading to the N.W. at 3 p.m. saw 1 light whale hauled without success. Middle part flying toward Latter part foggy at 5 a.m. saw a ship a fishing at 6 a.m. spoke the ship Circumetia of Stonington 30000 lbs. at 9 a.m. light whale at 10 hauled without success Lat 46.46.33.8 Long 76.30.00

Remarks on Friday Nov 6th

Came with breeze from the N.W. and rainy weather still in chase of whales but very wild & sail in site. Middle part strong gale from the North Latter part ditto with rain Lat 46.46.52.8 Long 76.40.00

Remarks on Saturday Nov 7th

Came with strong Gale from North to N.W. and thick squally weather heading to the N.W. at 5 heaved ship to the N.W. at night blowing very heavy. Middle part ditto Latter part at 2 the wind hauled to the west heaved ship to the N.W. with a very heavy sail on Lat 46.50.8 Long 76.35.00

Remarks on Sunday November 4th 1850

Commenced with strong Gale from the N.W. to west and squally rugged weather heading to the North under close reef. 1 sail in site at 7 heaved ship to the N.W. Middle part strong Gale and heavy squally Latter part ditto at 9 a.m. heaved ship to the N.W. at 10 a.m. saw a ship. Latter Middle part Lat 46.77.10.00 Long 77.10.00

Remarks on Monday November 5th

Commenced with strong wind from the N.W. to N.W. and thick foggy rainy weather heading to the N.W. under close reef. at 3 p.m. saw a bark ship heading ditto at 4 heaved ship to the N.W. at 10 took in fore & main & 1st mast. Middle part increasing to a gale from the N.W. Latter strong gale with squalls of rain fog & Lat 46.46.10.8 Long 77.30.00

Remarks on Tuesday Nov 6th

Commenced with strong Gale from the N.W. and squally rainy weather heading to the N.W. under short sail at 5 heaved ship to the N.W. & 1st double reef. Middle part strong wind and squally Latter part at 6 a.m. heaved ship to the N.W. at 9 the wind increased to a strong Gale from the North with rain saw 1 ship close by Lat 46.46.52.8 Long 77.15.00

Remarks on Wednesday Nov 7th

Commenced with a heavy Gale from the North and squally rainy weather heading to the N.W. under close reef. Main top Middle part heavy Gale & much rain Latter part at 5 the wind hauled to the west at 8 a.m. heaved ship to the N.W. Lat 46.46.53.8 Long 77.25.00

Remarks on Thursday Nov 8th

Commenced with strong Gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the North under close reef top sail 1 sail in site. Middle part squally Latter part more moderate at 7 a.m. saw 1 light whale hauled without success Lat 46.46.42.8 Long 77.10.00
