

Remarks on Wednesday December 23rd 1855

Came with strong wind from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the South at 1 p.m. saw eight whales lowered and galled him at eight double reef. Middle part Boiling Latter part Boiling heading to the N.W. at 10 heaved ship to the North. Lat $47^{\circ} 51' N$. Long $38^{\circ} 10' W$.

Remarks on Thursday Dec 24

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and squally rugged weather at 1 p.m. heaved ship to the N.W. with the land in sight about 25 miles off at 10 p.m. the wind increased to a heavy gale with rain latter at 3 more moderate Boiling at 7 came stormy downy. Lat $46^{\circ} 58' 09' N$. Long $36^{\circ} 36' 50' W$.

Remarks on Friday Dec 25

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. came in stormy downy & boiling saw 3 sail at 10 p.m. strong gale and squally with rain. Middle part little latter part at 3 finished boiling at 8 came stormy downy. Lat $46^{\circ} 45' 21' N$. Long $37^{\circ} 16' W$.

Remarks on Saturday Dec 26

Came with strong winds from the West and rugged weather heading to the North under short sail stormy downy 1 sail in sight Middle part strong gale Latter part at 1 heaved ship to the N.W. came in stormy downy in the fore hole at 10 finished. Lat $47^{\circ} 49' N$. Long $37^{\circ} 25' W$.

Remarks on Sunday Dec 27

Came with strong gale from the North and squally weather with rain heading to the N.W. under short sail saw 2 sail Middle part more Moderate Latter fog and rain saw 3 sail and 1 dead whale to fix you to see. Lat $45^{\circ} 15' N$. Long $37^{\circ} 50' W$.

Remarks on Monday December 28th 1855

Came with strong gale from the North to N.W. and heavy squalls heading to the N.W. under short sail at 7 p.m. more moderate Middle part little Latter part the wind heaved to the North at 10 took to the N.W. Lat $47^{\circ} 30' N$. Long $37^{\circ} 40' W$.

Remarks on Tuesday Dec 29th

Came with strong gale from the North and squally rainy weather heading to the N.W. under short sail at 7 p.m. spoke the ship *Stantek* of London bound to the South. Middle part strong gale and squally Latter part more Moderate at 10 a.m. saw a number of right whales lowered how boat struck and run of with him cut off. Lat $47^{\circ} 30' N$. Long $38^{\circ} 10' W$.

Remarks on Wednesday Dec 30

Came with strong winds from the West and squally rugged weather still fast to the whale at 3 p.m. out of the line and came on board stay thick fog. Middle part little Latter more moderate. Lat $46^{\circ} 47' 27' N$. Long $38^{\circ} 02' W$.

Remarks on Thursday Dec 31

Came with moderate breeze from the West and thick over cast weather stormy to the East at 4 p.m. spoke a French ship could not understand her name with no oil Middle part calm Latter part light and from the West. Steering to the East. Lat $46^{\circ} 47' 05' N$. Long $37^{\circ} 05' W$.

Remarks on Friday January 1st

Came with light breeze from the North and pleasant storm to the East at 4 p.m. saw the land at 2 p.m. took to the N.W. 6 sail in sight at night increasing to a gale with rain Middle part strong gale Latter little. Lat $47^{\circ} 25' N$. Long $38^{\circ} 15' W$.
