# Remarks on Monday January 18<sup>th</sup> 1847

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the S.W. at 5 pm 2 right whales lowered without success at 8 spoke the ship Mary of Edgarton 1500 lbs and Jefferson N.L. 1600 24 months out. Middle part

without success and struck 1 killed him and 11 took him to the ship and made ready to cut
