

Remarks on Saturday January 23rd 1867

Commenced with strong gale from the North and squally rainy weather heading to the South in company with the same at night made short sail. Middle part ditto latter part more moderate and some sail.

Remarks on Sunday Jan 24

Came with strong wind and heavy squalls heading to the N by E at 8 p.m. took a heavy squall split the fore topsail and done other damage. Middle part strong winds & squally latter part ditto at 10 more moderate made some sail.

Remarks on Monday Jan 25

Came with strong winds from the N by E and squally rugged weather steering to the N by E at night steered N by E. Middle part ditto latter part squally with a heavy sail.

Remarks on Tuesday Jan 26

Came with strong winds from the N by E and squally rugged weather steering to the North East in steering down. Middle part strong winds and squally latter ditto with thick fog.

Remarks on Wednesday Jan 27

Came with strong breeze from the West and thick fog steering to the North East in passing ship & Middle part light breeze latter part ditto with fine weather steering to the N by E.

Remarks on Thursday Jan 28

Came with light breeze from the South and pleasant steering to the E by E. Middle part ditto latter steering to the N by E at 11 a.m.

Remarks on Friday January 29th 1867

Came with strong wind from the South and rugged weather steering to the N by E at 2 p.m. spoke the ship Kearsage 15000 took in sail at night reversed ship to the N by E and to wait till after the morning. Middle part strong gale and usual latter part ditto with short sail.

Remarks on Saturday Jan 30

Came with strong gale from the South and squally rugged weather heading to the N by E at 1 p.m. reversed ship to the E by E. Middle part strong gale and rugged latter part at day light reversed ship to the E by E.

Remarks on Sunday Jan 31st

Came with strong winds from the South and squally rugged weather steering to the E by E at 5 p.m. saw the land being foggy hauled off Middle part calm latter at 2 a.m. took a light breeze from the North with thick overcast weather heading to the E by E at 10 a.m. saw the land.

Remarks on Monday February 1

Came with strong winds from the North and overcast weather heading to the N by E. Middle part calm latter light air and calm.

Remarks on Tuesday Feb 2

Came with light breeze from the East and pleasant weather heading to the N by E at 11 took to the N by E at night calm Middle part ditto latter part at 3 a.m. took a light breeze from the South steering East.

Remarks on Wednesday Feb 3rd

Came with light breeze from the N and pleasant steering in towards Talochuana at 5 p.m. of the day it came to anchor under cable in 15 fathoms Middle part calm latter part at 9 a.m. took an anchor and shot up the bay of Talochuana so each 5 miles from Shiping Talochuana.
