

Remarks on Sunday February 28th 1847

Commenced with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.E. at 1 p.m. saw 2 heavy Breaches 25 miles off at 5 p.m. saw 1 whale. At 7 p.m. took him to the ship's side and put him by the whale. Latter at 8 p.m. finished and kept off for the whale. At 9 p.m. nothing after.

Remarks on Monday March 1st 1847

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.E. sailing. Middle part ditto. Latter part at 5 p.m. finished sailing. At 9 a.m. saw the land dist. E. 50 miles.

Long. 78° 30' W.

Remarks on Tuesday March 2nd

Came with light air from the East and pleasant weather at 2 p.m. steering to the N.W. Middle part at 4 p.m. saw blackfish lowered struck & killed 4 lbs. Middle part. calm. Latter part. light air.

Long. 79° 00' W.

Remarks on Wednesday March 3rd

Commenced with light trades from the East and pleasant weather steering to the N.W. saw. Longfish caught on board fish & Middle part. moderate. Latter part. ditto at 6 a.m. steered to the N.W. with all sail set.

Lat. 12° 54' S.
Long. 80° 51' W.

Remarks on Thursday March 4th

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. saw. Dolphin & Middle part. light breeze. Latter ditto. Lat. 11° 18' S.

Long. 82° 26' W.

Remarks on Friday March 5th

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine weather steering to the N.W. Middle part. ditto. Latter part. at 8 p.m. steered N.W.

Lat. 9° 15' S.
Long. 83° 20' W.

Remarks on Saturday March 6th 1847

Commenced with light trades from the E. to S.E. and hot weather steering to the N.E. with all sail set. saw black fish, shark & Middle part. strong trades. Latter part. breeze and pleasant.

Lat. 8° 10' S.
Long. 84° 10' W.

Remarks on Sunday March 7th

Came with light trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.E. saw. finbacks, blackfish & Middle part. Latter at 4 a.m. steered to the N.W. saw fish &

Lat. 6° 18' S.
Long. 89° 13' W.

Remarks on Monday March 8th

Came with moderate trades from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N.W. Middle part. heavy rains (and calm). Latter part. ditto with abundance of rain at 9 a.m. more clear &

Lat. 4° 45' S.
Long. 89° 50' W.

Remarks on Tuesday March 9th

Commenced with light trades from the N.E. to S.E. and thick overcast weather heading to the N.W. with all sail set. Middle part. light air & calm. Latter part. light breeze from the N.E. to S.E.

Lat. 4° 05' S.
Long. 90° 00' W.

Remarks on Wednesday March 10th

Came with light breeze from the S.E. and overcast steering to the North saw Grampases, porpoises & Middle part. calm. Latter light breeze (and overcast and hot weather).

Lat. 3° 40' S.
Long. 90° 05' W.

Remarks on Thursday March 11th

Came with light air from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the North at night. squally. Middle part heavy rains. Latter ditto at 10 a.m. steered to the West.

Lat. 2° 30' S.
Long. 91° 30' W.
