

Remarks on Tuesday May 18th 1847
 Come with strong gale from the N.W. and equally rugged weather heading to the E.N.E. under short sail Middleport. Strong Gale latter more moderate at day but made some sail heading to the N.W. from the N.W. at 10 a.m. Lat 52° 10' N. Long 161° 50' W.

Remarks on Wednesday May 19
 Come with strong winds from the West and thick overcast. Steering to the N.E. heading in company with the above men ship. Between at 3 p.m. saw the Walrus boats lower for a whale at 4 p.m. another sail a head at 4 1/2 p.m. a light whale lowered at 5 struck killed and sunk him. At 7 p.m. come on board took in sail Middleport heading latter made all sail but two sail Lat 52° 25' N. Long 161° 10' W.

Remarks on Thursday May 20
 Come with strong winds from the S.E. and thick fog steering to the E.N.E. at night took in sail and heaved ship to the N.W. Middleport light breeze latter thick fog at 9 a.m. clear saw 1 sail at 11 a.m. saw a light whale towards S.E. Lat 52° 50' N. Long 160° 20' W.

Remarks on Friday May 21
 Come with light breeze from the S.E. heading to the Eastward at 1 p.m. lowered and pulled to the windward but with no success at night saw several whales Middleport by day under short sail latter thick foggy rainy weather heading to the North at 10 a.m. saw a light whale to the N.W. to lower Lat 52° 50' N. Long 159° 30' W.

Remarks on Saturday May 22
 Come with strong winds from the N.E. and thick foggy heavy weather heading to the West at 2 p.m. saw 2 light whales at 3 lowered struck on and drew the Iron at 4 come on board at night took in sail to rugged sea. whale killed and latter part 5 p.m. saw 2 light whales at 6 lowered and hoisted whale well Lat 52° 01' N. Long 158° 45' W.

Remarks on Sunday May 23rd 1847
 Come with light breeze from the S.W. and fine weather heading sharp by the N.E. & saw 1 whale towards at night double reef Middleport heading to the S.E. latter at 6 a.m. back to the N. at 11 saw 1 light whale towards down S.E. end saw birds. Lat 52° 30' N. Long 158° 45' W.

Remarks on Monday May 24
 Come with light breeze from S.E. and overcast heading to the S.W. at 1 p.m. spoke the ship Brooklyn of New London 2650 nothing this season at 6 p.m. saw a light whale lowered at 7 struck killed and sunk him Head Luck at night took in sail Middleport under short sail latter part heading to the S.E. at 9 a.m. saw 2 sails Lat 52° 10' N. Long 157° 00' W.

Remarks on Tuesday May 25
 Come with strong winds from the N.E. and overcast heading to the East at 3 p.m. spoke the Brooklyn and Landed at night strong winds and heavy squalls at 9 p.m. took in fore & mizzen top sails steering to the S.E. Middleport latter at 3 made sail saw birds at 11 a.m. spoke the ship Meenkar 3 whales for ends Gaming Lat 51° 09' N. Long 153° 52' W.

Remarks on Wednesday May 26th
 Come with strong winds from the N.E. and overcast heading sharp by the N.W. in company with the Meenkar & Brooklyn at night double reef Middleport strong winds and foggy latter drift with some rain carrying sail to get to the North Lat 51° 30' N. Long 156° 30' W.

Remarks on Thursday May 27th
 Come with strong winds from the North and thick foggy weather heading to the North under short sail at 4 heaved ship to the N.E. & S. Middleport more moderate latter made all sail saw 3 sails Lat 51° 41' N. Long 157° 25' W.
