

Remarks on Monday June 7th

Came with light breeze from the East and thick fog heading to the South under double reef. With a very heavy sea on Middle part then light breeze with heavy fog heading to the South. Lat 49° 53' N. Long 156° 20' W.

Remarks on Tuesday June 8

Came with a light breeze from the North and thick fog and rain at rising to the S.W. at 5 pm saw a sail at 5 spoke the ship Catherine of New London 2 whale at 8 took in sail steered to the S.W. Middle part thick fog. Latter date with rain at 7 pm left to at 8 am saw 1 light whale heading to the S.W. kept off to west run of him but to rugged. far to lower and foggy saw birds. Lat 49° 52' N. Long 155° 37' W.

Remarks on Wednesday June 9

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick foggy weather steering to the S.W. after the above whale at 1 pm lost the run of him being foggy at 11 pm took in sail heading to the N.W. Middle part with latter part steered to the South saw 2 whales. Lat 49° 50' N. Long 155° 05' W.

Remarks on Thursday June 10

Came with strong winds and foggy weather heading to the South at 11 pm took in sail Middle part steered to the S.W. Lat 49° 50' N. Long 155° 02' W.

Remarks on Friday June 11

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick foggy weather heading to the S.W. at 3 pm heaved ship to the North. At night took in sail heading to the Middle part strong winds. Latter part at 4 a.m. heaved ship to the S.W. saw 2 whales and 2 seals. Lat 49° 55' N. Long 155° 10' W.

Remarks on Saturday June 12th 1847

Came with strong winds from the West and thick rainy weather heading to the N.W. at 3 pm saw 3 light whales at 6 lowered and galled them at 8 am on board at night took in sail heading to the same course. Middle part light breeze and foggy. Latter heaved ship to the S.W. at 3 a.m. saw 2 light whales. Lost to the ship at 4 lowered at 5 pm. Struck 1 killed him at 7 took him to the ship at 9 a.m. came cutting. Lat 49° 45' N. Long 155° 05' W.

Remarks on Sunday June 13

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick foggy weather. Employed in cutting at 1 pm pushed at 3 pm heaved ship to the West. Bailing at night increasing to a gale. Middle part strong gale and with rain. Latter date took down at 12 heaved ship to the S.W. Lat 49° 50' 22" N. Long 155° 44" W.

Remarks on Monday June 14

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the S.W. under short sail at 4 more moderate at 7 saw a light whale close to the ship. Middle part strong gale and heavy squalls. Latter date at 1 a.m. heaved ship to the N.W. saw 2 whales. Lat 49° 50' 19" N. Long 155° 45" W.

Remarks on Tuesday June 15

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. and coming bailing at 3 pm spoke the ship ~~Greenport~~ Greenport 3 whale at night more moderate at 11 pm heaved ship to the S.W. at 8 a.m. saw the ship Edward boats down manurevery at 10 the wind hauled to the S.W. heaved ship to the S.W. at 11 light rain. Lat 49° 50' 05" N. Long 155° 55" W.

Remarks on Wednesday June 16

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick rainy weather steering to the N.W. bailing at 3 pm broiled down for rain at 3 pm saw a light whale at 11 pm took in sail heading to the West. Middle part strong gale. Latter date at 6 a.m. heaved ship to the S.W. at 7 am bailing again. Lat 49° 50' 25" N. Long 156° 41" W.
