

Remarks on Thursday June 17th

Came with strong winds from the SW and squally rugged weather heading to the SE to the NE and shot sail. Bailing saw 1 sail to leeward. Middle part strong wind. Latter with it. At 4 p.m. sailed down and saw a light whale headward at 11 p.m. lowered at 10 p.m. with them and from 10 p.m. and very rugged and he was with him when. Latter of the 49.44. N. Long of the 153.00 W.

Remarks on Friday June 18th

Came with strong winds and squally and very rugged still fast to the whale at 2 p.m. parted the short warp and of he went to the windward to come on board. At 4 p.m. heavy mist, 4 p.m. and cold amongst. I will assume you at 5 p.m. saw 3 more whales lowered and galled them at 7 p.m. came on board took in sail. Middle part heavy mist short sail. Latter at 4 p.m. saw light whales at 6 p.m. lowered and galled them at 11 p.m. more whales kept of lower without success. Latter of the 49.38. N. Long of the 153.34 W.

Remarks on Saturday June 19th

Came with strong winds from the SW and and rugged weather heading to the NW at 3 p.m. light whale at 3 p.m. lowered and hoisted at 4 p.m. saw more whale. At night took in sail. Middle part light air and calm. Latter ditto at 4 p.m. saw light whales at 6 p.m. lowered & hoisted being calm and very dry. Latter of the 49.48. N. Long of the 153.52 W.

Remarks on Sunday June 20th

Came with light air and calm heading to the SW at 2 p.m. saw light whale lowered without success at 4 p.m. lowered and the bow boat made a halcyon over. Middle part calm. Latter at 3 a.m. the wind increased to almost a gale & double reef. At 4 p.m. saw light whale at 6 p.m. lowered without success. Latter of the 49.28. N. Long of the 153.32 W.

Remarks on Monday June 21st

Came with strong winds from the NW and squally rugged weather heading to the SW at 1 p.m. lowered ship to the NW. Saw great number of fish and feed on fish in situ. Latter of the 49.44. N. Middle part light breeze. Latter at 6 p.m. lowered ship to the SW. Latter of the 49.44. N. Long of the 153.40 W.

Remarks on Tuesday June 22nd

Came with light breeze from the NW and was east heading to the SW at 3 p.m. saw the ship. Lowered boats down and galled the whale at 4 p.m. we lowered for their with no success being very dry at night took in sail heading to the NW. Middle part moderate. Latter strong winds at 4 p.m. saw a light whale at 5 p.m. lowered and galled him took up the boat and heading to the NW at 9 a.m. lowered ship. Latter of the 49.44. N. Long of the 153.30 W.

Remarks on Wednesday 23rd

Came with strong winds from the East and squally rugged weather heading to the South in pursuit of the above galled whale at 10 a.m. saw him at 10 p.m. lowered and struck him killed him at 11 took him to the ship and made ready for to cut. Latter of the 49.50. N. Long of the 153.55 W.

Remarks on Thursday 24th

Came with a gale from the E to ENE and thick foggy rainy weather at 2 p.m. came cutting out in 1 top whye heaving up to take the head the ship. Calhoun being broke and a piece of it struck me on the head and temple with great force which hurt me very bad. Came near of losing my eye at 10 p.m. finished cutting being very rugged and a very large whale. Middle part more moderate with thick fog. Latter ditto at 4 p.m. lowered ship to the NW and commenced bailing at 9 the wind increased to a gale with fog & rain. Latter of the 49.55. N. Long of the 154.10 W.
