Came with strong winds from the N.E. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. under short sail hailing at 7 pm the wind increased to a strong Gale with heavy rain at 7 1/2 cooled down and saw a back Ship to the seaward Middle part strong Gale latter with the sea.

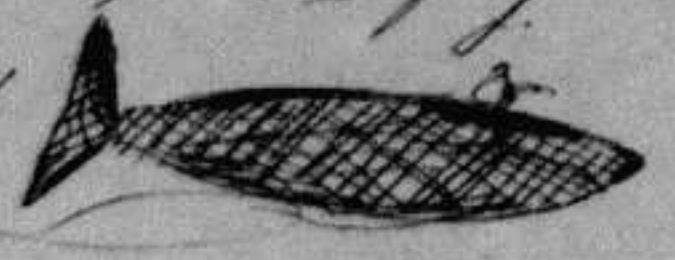
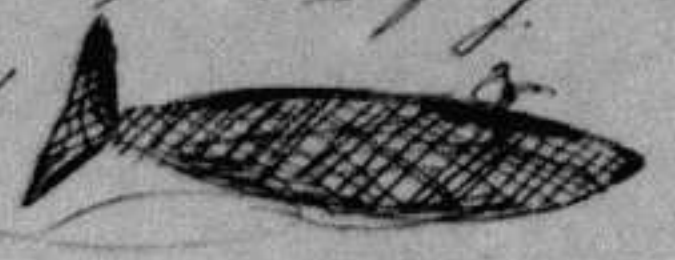
Remarks on Saturday 26

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and pleasant weather heading to the N.W. hailing Middle part ditto latter strong various courses

Remarks on Sunday June 27

Came with light breezes from the N.W. and pleasant weather heading to the E.P.E. hailing at 2 pm saw 2 right whales going quick lowered with No success at night took in sail heading W by N Middle part ditto latter heading to the N.W. at 4 1/2 m cooled down at 5 1/2 m saw a right whale at 9 lowered at 10 struck killed him at 11 took him to the ship and made ready for to cut

Remarks on Monday June 28

Came with light winds and pleasant weather at 4 pm came cutting at 7 pm finished & Middle part hailing latter part ditto with fog at 8 a.m. heaved ship to the west. saw 4 backs &  Latter part ditto with fog at 8 a.m. heaved ship to the west. saw 4 backs & 

Remarks on Tuesday June 29

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick squally foggy weather heading to the west at 4 took in sail hailing & blowing down Middle part strong winds with rain & fog latter ditto heading to the west hailing at 11 a.m. spoke the ship Edward nothing seen latter we saw her to E. with fog

Remarks on Wednesday June 30th 1847

Came with strong winds from the N.W. and thick heavy weather heading to the N.E. saw 1 right whale going to the windward Eng. in hailing & blowing down at night the wind increased to a gale attended with fog & rain Middle part heavy rain latter at 2 more moderate saw 2 whales 1 pair in sea

Remarks on Thursday July 1 1847

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. under short sail Eng. hailing & blowing down at 3 pm finished hailing at 4 pm knock of blowing being to heavy sea on and furled the Fore sail with a heavy gale Middle part ditto with heavy squalls latter the same saw 1 sail

Remarks on Friday July 2

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. at 8 pm heaved ship to the N.E. with a high West Middle part more moderate at 12 heaved ship to the N.W. latter strong gale and a high sea employed in blowing down

Remarks on Saturday July 3

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and heavy weather heading to the west Eng. in blowing down in the after hole at night more moderate Middle part almost calm latter more pleasant at 4 heaved ship to the south saw great number of porpoises

Remarks on Sunday July 4

Came with moderate breezes from the west and pleasant weather heading to the west saw 4 backs porpoises at 8 double reef steering ditto Middle part light breezes latter moderate at 5 a.m. saw 2 right whales at 6 lowered at 7 struck killed at 8 took him to the ship and made ready for to cut for 2 sails
