

Remarks on Wednesday July 25th 1867

Came with light air from the South and fine pleasant weather Steady to the E by N at 2 pm saw a light whale lowered and made a whiff at 4 pm on board. Heard the above course. Meddell put calm latter with the thick fog saw some small fish.

Lat 44° 52' 25" N

Long 141° 40' 00" W

Remarks on Thursday July 26th

Came with a calm heading to the North at 1 pm the fog let up. at 2 pm saw a light whale turns yellow 2 1/2 miles off. at 3 lowered galled him being to calm to get on at 5 came on board at night took light air from the East. Meddell light air any fog latter part with the thick fog is usual heading to the E by N

Lat 44° 52' 50" N

Long 140° 25' 00" W

Remarks on Friday July 27th

Came with light air from the N. and thick fog Steady to the E by N at 4 pm saw a Ship 2 points on the Starboard bow at 10 pm spoke the Ship Benjamin Morgan 9 whales Meddell put heading to the Eastward latter at 7 pm saw a light whale at 9 lowered struck it. Lat 44° 52' 40" N

Long 138° 20' 00" W

Remarks on Saturday July 28th

Came with strong winds from the West and thick foggy weather Still past to the whale at 3 pm killed him. at 5 took him to the ship and went for another being foggy dare not strike at 6 came cutting at 8 took in the life & throat and Lashed down for the light. Meddell put. Laying by the the whale latter at 6 a m came cutting at 10 finished and made a pie for ends 1 mile with Lat 44° 52' 44" N

Long 137° 23' 00" W

Remarks on Sunday August 1st

Came with strong winds from the West and overcast weather heading to the North at 2 pm spoke the Ship Cherokee Cleveland 6 whales at 6 pm saw 2 light whales lowered and galled them Meddell put sailing latter did ditto at 9 a m looking whale to underward

Lat 44° 52' 54" N

Long 137° 05' 00" W

Remarks on Monday August 2nd 1867

Came with light breeze from the Westward and foggy weather at 2 pm saw a whale lowered and galled him chased him 3 hours and then gain him up. Meddell put steady latter heading to the Westward saw Sulphur bottom & Lat

Remarks on Tuesday August 3rd

Came with light air and calm and foggy heading to the North at 2 pm saw a light whale going quick to the Westward at 4 spoke the bark Capt. Some on board & at 7 pm took a breeze from the N. heading sharp by the W. with all sail set. Meddell put ditto latter part at 4 a m finished sailing at 6 am Steady downy & Lat 44° 52' 37" N

Long 137° 45' 00" W

Remarks on Wednesday August 4th

Came with strong winds from the West to N. and foggy weather heading to the S by E at 1 pm back to the E by N Steady downy at 4 pm spoke the Ship Fabians 12 whales at night took in sail Meddell and latter part at day light saw 6 Ship 1 sailing the other Steady to the Eastward saw tracks & so ends Steady of the fish hatch Lat 44° 52' 46" N

Long 137° 00' 00" W

Remarks on Thursday August 5th

Came with light breeze from the W and foggy weather at 1 pm steered to the Eastward Steady in the N by E at night took in sail steered the above course Meddell put ditto latter part the same thick fog it is more clear at 11 saw a Ship at 11 spoke the Ship Abed Mitchell 6 whales so ends with 2 sails in ditto Lat 44° 52' 45" N

Long 135° 20' 00" W

Remarks on Friday August 6th

Came with strong winds from the N. and thick overcast Steering to the N E by E to East at 2 pm spoke the Ship Alexander wanting 1 whale to fall and spoke the Ship Howland 7 whales at 8 pm beat up heading to the N. Meddell put ditto latter part heading N by E saw four tracks & 1 sail in ditto at 10 a m at 11 lowered and galled him & Lat 44° 52' 20" N
