

Remarks on Tuesday August 17th 1847.

Came with strong winds from the NW and overcast weather heading sharp by the light. Middle part ditto. Latter strong winds at 8 a.m. barred away the flying jib boom & saw jibsacks at 12 p.m. a fair. Lat 46° 54' 29" N. Long 150° 02' W.

Remarks on Wednesday August 18th

Came with light winds from the South and overcast heavy to the westward saw great number of jibsacks and saw a ship maneuvering at 9 p.m. spoke the ship Tupper who had lost stores that day. Middle part light air. Latter part heavy to the west with thick fog & rain saw some jibsacks but no light whales. Lat 46° 54' 45" N. Long 152° 05' W.

Remarks on Thursday August 19th

Came with strong winds from the NE and thick squally foggy weather heavy to the west with all sail set at 7 spoke the above men ship & double reef and hove about. Middle part ditto. Latter at 4 heaved ship heading sharp by the light. Lat 46° 54' 25" N. Long 154° 30' W.

Remarks on Friday August 20th

Came with light winds from the NW and pleasant weather heading sharp by the light. Saw jibsacks at 1 p.m. saw 1 light whale lowered without success at 3 p.m. Steered off to the South Middle part light breezes Latter at 4 took the wind from the South at 7 a.m. back to the NW saw jibsacks in great numbers to ends. Lat 46° 53' 18" N. Long 156° 15' W.

Remarks on Saturday August 21st

Came with light winds from the South and overcast weather heading sharp by the light. at 2 p.m. kept off to the NW saw jibsacks & Middle part heavy ditto. Latter at 3 a.m. thick fog hove back at 4 Steered off to the North. At 7 a.m. to the wind heavy thick and rainy. Lat 46° 54' 45" N. Long 154° 20' W.

Remarks on Sunday August 22nd 1847

Commenced with strong winds from the South and thick foggy rainy weather heavy to the west under double reef at night. Steered ship to the East to ESE. Middle part heading ditto. Latter more moderate. Made sail at 11 a.m. back to the light. Lat 46° 54' 45" N. Long 153° 50' W.

Remarks on Monday August 23rd

Came with strong winds from the South and thick rainy weather with fog heading sharp by the light to the NW. Middle part heading to the SE to SW. Latter part heavy rain under double reef. Lat 46° 53' 30" N. Long 154° 55' W.

Remarks on Tuesday August 24th

Came with strong winds from the ESE. Attended with heavy rain at 2 the wind increased to a very heavy gale lying to under short sail with high sea on Middle part ditto. Latter part heading to the west. At 7 more moderate made some sail. Lat 46° 54' 15" N. Long 156° 50' W.

Remarks on Wednesday August 25th

Came with strong winds from the SE to ENE and thick rainy weather heading to the SE to SW with short sail set. Middle part ditto. Latter heavy rain and fog and a high sea. Lat 46° 53' 12" N. Long 156° 30' W.

Remarks on Thursday August 26th

Came with strong winds from the South to ENE and squally rainy weather heading to the SE backing as it requires. Middle part strong gale. Latter ditto with a very heavy sea rolling from the South. Lat 46° 52' 10" N. Long 157° 00' W.

Remarks on Friday August 27th

Came with strong gale from the SE and heavy squally heading to the SE. At 1 the wind increased to all most a hurricane blew long for topmast stayed. Middle part more moderate. Latter part at 7 made more sail. At 8 hove up to the SE saw kites & Lat 46° 52' 00" N. Long 158° 05' W.
