

Remarks on Tuesday Nov 9th 1847
Commenced with strong wind
from the East to S.E. and squally rugged weather heading
sharp by the S.W. Middle part ditto latter heavy squalls
Attended with rain Lat 47° 18.05 N.
Long 157° 35 W.

Remarks on Wednesday 10th
Commenced with strong wind from the
East and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the S.E.
at 8 p.m. took in sail and beared ship to the N.E. Middle
and latter at 1 a.m. beared back to the S.E. at day light made
all prudent sail at 9 a.m. the Ice Whyluck bearing E by
Sist. 8 leagues to East with strong wind Lat 47° 03 N.
Long 160° 15 W.

Remarks on Thursday 11th
Commenced with strong wind from the
S.E. and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the S.E.
Middle part ditto latter light wind at day light saw the
Ice Crumple bearing S.E. Sist 8 leagues to East. Employing
in working to windward Lat 46° 40 N.
Long 160° 15 W.

Remarks on Friday Nov 12th
Commenced with light breeze from the
East to S.E. and pleasant weather Eng. in flying hummocks
backing as it requires. Middle part ditto latter at 9 a.m.
on shore after recruits and wood Lat 46° 40 N.
Long 160° 15 W.

Remarks on Saturday Nov 13th
Commenced with strong breeze, flying off.
Hon at 8 p.m. heading to the South with all sail set.
Middle part ditto latter the same Lat 46° 22-33 N.
Long 159° 47 W.

Remarks on Sunday Nov 14th
Commenced with strong breeze from
the East and pleasant steering to the S.E. Middle part
squally latter part ditto with rain at 9 the wind beated
to the South Lat 46° 25 N.
Long 159° 55 W.

Remarks on Monday November 15th 1847
Commenced with strong wind from
the North and light rain steering to the S.E. at 3 p.m. the wind
ralled to the N.W. Steered South at 5 p.m. took the wind from
the S.W. with heavy squalls of rain Middle latter part
heading to the S.E. Lat 46° 25 N.
Long 157° 30 W.

Remarks on Tuesday Nov 15th
Commenced with strong wind from the
S.W. and squally weather heading sharp by the S.E. Middle
part heading to the S.E. latter pleasant heading
to E by S. to S.E. saw some birds. Lat 46° 27 N.
Long 155° 00 W.

Remarks on Wednesday Nov 17th
Commenced with strong wind from
the South and pleasant weather heading to the S.E. with
all sail set. Middle part strong wind & squally latter part
ditto with a heavy sail on sea saw some birds Lat 46° 27 N.
Long 156° 10 W.

Remarks on Thursday Nov 18th
Commenced with strong wind from the
South and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the S.E. Middle
part ditto latter part heading to the N.E. Lat 46° 05 N.
Long 152° 05 W.

Remarks on Friday Nov 19th
Commenced with light breeze from
the S.E. and pleasant at 1 p.m. took to the S.W. at night heading
to the S.E. Middle part light air and calm latter part light
breeze saw 1 Tomback Lat 46° 30-20 N.
Long 152° 05 W.

Remarks on Saturday Nov 20th
Commenced with light breeze from
the N.E. and pleasant weather steering to the South Middle
part ditto latter part light breeze Lat 46° 31 N.
Long 152° 12 W.
