double reef Middle part rugged and squally. Laths more moderate
at 9 made all sail with a heavy sea. Lath 42.25 P
Long 42.10 W

Remarks on Monday Dec 6

Coming with light winds from the
South and overcast steering to the E.W. at 6 p.m. saw 1 large
whale at 6 p.m. Lawrence and called him and come on board on
steered to the East at 8 almost calm Middle part calm
Laths at 1 a.m. took a light breeze from the W.W. attended
with light rain. Lath 42.30 P

Remarks on Tuesday Dec 7

Coming with strong winds from
the W.W. and squally rainy weather steering to the East
with all sail set. at 7 p.m. the wind hauled to the S.W.
with squalls Middle and Laths part strong winds and rugged
with heavy squalls. Lath 42.25 P Long 42.30 W

Remarks on Wednesday December 8th 1847

Coming with strong Gale
from the S.W. and heavy squalls and very rugged steering to the
East with the trident sail out at 7 it increased to a very heavy
Gale took in all sail and hove to heading to the S.E. Middle
part calm. Lath 42.12 P
Long 42.37 W

Remarks on Thursday Dec 9

Coming with a gale from the S.W.
and squally rugged weather steering to the E.W. Middle part
strong East Laths more moderate. Lath 42.08 P
Long 42.31 W

Remarks on Friday Dec 10

Coming with strong winds
from the S.W. and squally weather steering to the East with
a very heavy sea rolling from the S.E. Middle part moderate
Laths dith at 7 a.m. took the wind from the S.W. saw
porpoises and great many whales birds. Lath 42.08 P
Long 42.37 W

Remarks on Saturday Dec 11

Coming with light winds
from the W.W. and overcast steering to the E.W. saw porpoises
and got 3 Middle part strong winds Laths dith with
the wind from West to S.W. Lath 42.38 P
Long 42.38 W

Remarks on Sunday December 12th

Commenced with strong winds
from the S.W. and squally rugged weather steering to the E.W.
at 11 double reef and David Wilson being very sick
taking 5 days since returning from the North and now
could not stop it. After trying every thing Middle part more
moderate Laths part almost calm at 1 a.m. David Wilson
died leaving his senses until the last minute. Laid him
out and put him off to ends. Lath 42.55 P
Long 42.10 W
