

Remarks on Thursday January 13th 1848.
Commenced with strong breeze from the west and fine pleasant weather heading sharp to the N.W. to N.W. by compass. Middle part fine weather. Latter part fine pleasant weather steering to the North and sailing to the west and fine weather. Lat 45° 55' N. Long 55° 25' W.

Remarks on Friday Jan 14th
Commenced with strong breeze from the west and fine pleasant weather steering to the North and sailing to the west and fine pleasant weather. Middle part light breeze and pleasant. Latter fine weather at day light saw 3 seals. Lat 45° 55' N. Long 55° 38' W.

Remarks on Saturday Jan 15th
Commenced with strong breeze from the west and pleasant weather heading to the North with all sail set at 5 pm spoke the Ship Mistake South 300 lbs 400 spinn. Middle part heading to the N.W. Latter strong wind and squally at 4 pm on double reef at 10 how to with gale. Lat 45° 35' N. Long 55° 20' W.

Remarks on Sunday Jan 16th
Commenced with strong gale from the north and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. at 4 pm wind hauled to the N.W. and more moderate. Middle part fine weather. Latter ditto at 8 the wind hauled to the North heading west. at 10 the wind increased to almost a gale. Lat 45° 45' N. Long 55° 30' W.

Remarks on Monday Jan 17th
Commenced with strong wind from the west and pleasant weather heading to the west to the N.W. at night took in sail. Middle part ditto. Latter part the wind increased to a gale and to hail. Lat 45° 41' N. Long 55° 44' 16' W.

Remarks on Tuesday Jan 18th
Commenced with strong wind from the N.W. and rugged at 1 pm heard ship to the N.W. at 2 kept off to the North. Middle part strong wind. Latter part at 5 am kept off to the N.W. and for back to the N.W. Lat 45° 10' N. Long 52° 55' W.

Remarks on Wednesday January 19th 1848
Commenced with strong wind from the N.W. and squally rugged weather heading to the N.W. at 5 pm took to the west at 7 took a gale attended with heavy rain and lightning and very large hail stones. Middle part strong gale. Latter part heading to the N.W. Lat 45° 32' N. Long 52° 45' W.

Remarks on Thursday Jan 20th
Commenced with a gale from the west and squally rugged weather heading to the North part porpoises. at night more moderate. Middle part squally. Latter part at 6 am kept off to the North with heavy squally hail. Lat 45° 15' N. Long 52° 25' W.

Remarks on Friday Jan 21st
Commenced with a gale from the N.W. and squally weather attended with rain & hail. Steering to the N.W. under short sail saw porpoises and some birds. Middle part strong gale. Latter more moderate steering to the North. Lat 45° 40' N. Long 51° 32' W.

Remarks on Saturday Jan 22nd
Commenced with a gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather steering to the North at night took in sail heading to the N.W. Middle part strong wind and rugged. Latter part strong gale heading to the N.W. Lat 45° 35' N. Long 50° 23' W.

Remarks on Sunday Jan 23rd
Commenced with strong gale from the west and squally rugged weather heading to the North at 2 pm saw a bark ship heading to the South at night heeded ship to the N.W. Middle part strong gale from the N.W. heading to the N.W. under short sail. Latter ditto with a heavy gale and very rugged. Lat 45° 38' 22' N. Long 50° 45' W.

Remarks on Monday Jan 24th
Commenced with strong gale from the N.W. and squally rugged weather at 1 pm heard ship to the N.W. Middle part ditto. Latter more moderate steering to the East. Lat 45° 37' 49' N. Long 49° 45' W.
