

Remarks on Monday February 6th 1848

Commenced with strong winds from the N. and pleasant weather steering to the E. V. E. with all sail set Middle part strong winds and squally Latter part with the wind knock her off the E. V. E. and jumper's progress

Long $74^{\circ} 38' 08''$ W.

Remarks on Tuesday Feb 7

Came with strong winds from the S. E. and squally rugged weather steering to the N. E. V. E. under double reef. Middle part squally Latter part at 4 took the wind from the North

Lat $40^{\circ} 29' 30''$ N.

Long $74^{\circ} 35' 00''$ W.

Remarks on Wednesday

Came with strong winds from the N. W. and squally rainy weather heading to the N. E. under close reef with a heavy sea in. Middle part almost calm and a very heavy sea Latter part took a light breeze from the North heading to the East

Lat $40^{\circ} 29' 15''$ N.

Long $74^{\circ} 34' 07''$ W.

Remarks on Thursday Feb 8

Came with light breeze from the North and fine pleasant weather heading sharp by the N. W. tacking as it required Middle part light airs & calm Latter part calm

Long $74^{\circ} 34' 15''$ W.

Remarks on Thursday 10

Came with light breeze from the N. E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the N. W. saw Cow fish &c. Middle part light breezes Latter part little with hot weather

Remarks on Friday 11th

Came with light breeze from the East and fine pleasant weather heading sharp by the N. W. Middle part light breeze Latter part little heading to the N. W.

Remarks on Saturday February 12th 1848

Commenced with light airs from the E. V. E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the N. W. at 2 p.m. tacked to the S. E. V. E. Middle part light breeze and calm Latter with heading to the E. V. E. to East

Remarks on Sunday Feb 13

Came with light breeze from the E. V. E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the East at Night Calm Middle part light airs & calm Latter part light airs from the East and pleasant at 10 a.m. saw a large ship steering to the N. W. so Ende

Remarks on Monday Feb 14

Came with light breeze from the E. to E. V. E. and fine pleasant weather heading sharp by the North to N. E. at Night light squalls Middle part light breeze Latter part little at 9 p.m. a very heavy sea to the N. W.

Remarks on Tuesday Feb 15

Came with light breeze from the E. V. E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the N. E. V. E. at 2 p.m. spoke the above mentioned ship which was a Dutchman bound to Mount Yedra at 4 p.m. another steering to the N. W. Middle part light airs and pleasant Latter part light trades heading to the N. E.

Remarks on Wednesday Feb 16

Commenced with light trades from the E. V. E. and fine pleasant weather steering to the N. E. V. E. at 3 p.m. saw a small 3 masted Schooner heading to the South Middle part light breeze and light squall of rain Latter pleasant breeze from East to E. V. E. and hot weather
