

Remarks on Thursday, February 17th 1848
Commenced with light Trades
from the East to ESE and fine pleasant weather
Steering to the NW at 3 p.m. saw a Bark Ship. Steering to
the NW Middle part light trades latter part with
with hot weather sun 1 sail steering NW at 4 p.m. South.

Remarks on Friday Feb 18
Commenced with light Trades from
the E to SE and fine pleasant weather Steering to the NE
with all sail Middle part with light squalls
of rain and calms Lat 18° 15' S.
Long 33° 39' W.

Remarks on Saturday Feb 19
Commenced with light Trades
from the ESE to SE and fine weather Steering to the NE at night
took light squalls of rain 1 sail in sight a storm Middle
part strong breeze latter with heading to the NE sun 2 sails.
Steering to the South on sail on the NE sun Lat 18° 14' S.
Long 33° 27' W.

Remarks on Sunday Feb 20
Commenced with light Trades from the
ENE to ESE and pleasant. Steering to the North E. Middle
part heading to the NE. Middle part at 5 a.m. heading sharp
by the NE 1 sail in sight Lat 16° 39' S.
Long 33° 39' W.

Remarks on Monday Feb 21
Commenced with light Trades from the
NE E to East and fine pleasant weather heading to the North
to NE Middle part strong breeze latter part moderate
and hot weather Lat 12° 33' S.
Long 33° 59' W.

Remarks on Tuesday Feb 22
Commenced with light Trades
from the ESE to East and fine weather Steering to the NE at
4 p.m. took heavy squalls attended with rain Middle part
pleasant Steering NE by N latter fine weather Lat 10° 58' S.
Long 33° 45' W.

Remarks on Wednesday, February 23rd 1848
Commenced with light Trades
from the ESE to SE and fine pleasant weather Steering to the NE
with all sail set Middle part strong trades latter with Steering
from NE by N took squalls at 4 p.m. saw the land bearing NE Dist by
Compass 45 miles saw great number of birds sun 2 sails at 5 p.m.

Remarks on Thursday, Feb 24
Commenced with moderate Trades
from the SE and fine pleasant weather Steering in towards Bermuda
at 4 p.m. off the Towns Lagoon of and on for the night 4 sails laying
outside the reef Middle part laying off 8 miles latter part 1 sail in
went on shore one American Sloop from Philadelphia 4 days out.
So each took of some cargo &c. Lat 34° 35' N.
Long 74° 35' W.

Remarks on Friday Feb 25
Commenced with light Trades from the
SE and pleasant. Still Laying off 8 miles Middle part with light
part at 8 a.m. came on board and Steered to the North the ship
Abraham H. Howland arrived as we left would likely leave
at night. so each Lat 34° 34' N.
Long 74° 38' W.

Remarks on Saturday Feb 26
Commenced with strong Trades from
the SE and fine pleasant weather Steering to the NE by E.
1 sail in sight a head Middle part strong trades
latter part with Steering to the North Lat 34° 50' N.
Long 74° 29' W.

Remarks on Sunday Feb 27
Commenced with strong Trades from the
SE to NE and fine pleasant weather Steering to the NE
with all sail set Middle part with light squalls
and fine from the SE Lat 35° 11' N.
Long 74° 49' W.
