

Remarks on Monday February 28th 1848

Came with the strong trade from the East to ESE and fine weather heading to the NW Middle part moderate and squally latter part light air and calm steering to the North
Lat 40° 29' N. Long 73° 45' W.

Remarks on Tuesday March 1st

Came with the light breeze from the East to SE and squally rainy weather steering to the NW with all sail set. Middle part squally latter with much rain birds from the South to East saw plenty of fish
Lat 40° 10' N. Long 73° 40' W.

Remarks on Wednesday March 1st

Came with light wind from all arounds heading to the NW with squalls of rain and calm. Middle part moderate breeze latter strong winds from the East to NE and rugged squally weather
Lat 40° 2' 38' N. Long 73° 43' W.

Remarks on Thursday March 2nd

Came with strong winds from the NE and squally weather steering sharp by the NW Middle part strong breeze latter with heading to the NW
Lat 40° 4' 35' N. Long 73° 40' 29' W.

Remarks on Friday March 3rd

Commenced with strong breeze from the NE and pleasant weather heading sharp by the NW with all sail set. Middle part strong winds & squally latter part with rugged weather
Lat 40° 5' 05' N. Long 73° 42' 25' W.

Remarks on Saturday March 4th

Came with strong trade from the NE and squally rugged weather heading sharp by the NW Middle part strong winds latter part with strong trade and rugged steering NW
Lat 40° 08' 20' N. Long 73° 46' 00' W.

Remarks on Sunday March 5th 1848

Came with the strong trade from the NE and squally rugged weather steering to the NW Middle part strong winds latter part with strong trade
Lat 40° 10' 18' N. Long 73° 45' 02' W.

Remarks on Monday March 6th

Commenced with strong trade from the NE to ESE and squally rugged weather steering to the NW with all prudent sail on Middle part strong trade latter part ditto with some squalls
Lat 40° 12' 50' N. Long 73° 48' 30' W.

Remarks on Tuesday March 7th

Came with the strong trade from the ESE and fine weather steering to the NW Middle part strong breeze latter part with fine weather
Lat 40° 15' 12' N. Long 73° 51' 49' W.

Remarks on Wednesday March 8th

Commenced with strong trade from the ESE to E and fine pleasant weather steering to the NW by N. Eng. in pursuing the spars Middle part strong breeze latter ditto at 9 a.m. saw a sail
Lat 40° 17' 25' N. Long 73° 52' 19' W.

Remarks on Thursday March 9th

Came with strong trade from the ESE to East and fine weather steering to the NW with all sail set at 2 p.m. past by a whale ship steering to the NW at night squally with rain wind ESE saw black fish & Middle part strong breeze latter part with squalls attended with light rain at 8 a.m. saw 2 sails 1 heavy heading to the NE 1 ship steering to the NW
Lat 40° 19' 25' N. Long 73° 54' 50' W.

Remarks on Friday March 10th

Came with the strong breeze from the ESE and pleasant steering to the NW preparing for pursuing washing ship & Middle part strong winds latter part at 3 p.m. pursuing ship made 3a ends with squalls
Lat 40° 20' 51' N. Long 73° 57' 22' W.
