

Ship Pacific Outward Bound 1851.

80. Friday May 9th All these 24 hours light breezes and calm. One sail in sight. Finbacks and Grampuses bent the main topsail. Noon Lat 38° 00' Long 38° 39'
81. Saturday May 10th Commenced with light breezes and fine weather steering N.E. until 11th hour to 12th Mornight. Kept off N.E. Latter part strong breezes took in sail and hove to under close reef main topsail and staysails. Noon Lat 38° 10' Long 38° 45'
82. Sunday May 11th Commenced with fresh breezes and squally heading from E.N.E. to N.W. finbacks in sight. Noon Lat 39° 09' Long 38° 19'
83. Monday May 12th Commenced with strong breezes and squally, nothing in sight. Noon Lat 40° 10' Long 38° 50'
84. Tuesday May 13th All these 24 hours strong Gale from N.E. Lying to under close reef main topsail and staysails. Latter part saw sperm whales going quick to windward and to lugged to lowered a boat. Noon Lat 39° 31' N. Long 38° 21' W.
85. Wednesday May 14th First part of these 24 hours strong Gale N.E. and cloudy. Latter part moderate one sail in sight. Noon Lat 39° 31' Long 38° 42'
86. Thursday May 15th All these 24 hours moderate breezes and fair weather steering by the wind 2 sails in sight. Noon Lat 39° 26' Long 38° 50'
87. Friday May 16th First part light airs & calm. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breezes & E.S.E. steering by the wind to the S. Noon Lat 38° 37' Long 38° 25' W.

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88. Saturday May 17th All these 24 hours light airs with passing fog. Squalls finbacks heading to the E. Noon Lat 37° 39' N. Long 38° 00'
89. Sunday May 18th All these 24 hours light breezes with calm finbacks in sight heading by the wind to E by N. Noon Lat 38° 02' N. Long 37° 36' W.
90. Monday May 19th All these 24 hours fresh breezes from S. to S.W. heading by the wind to E. Nothing in sight. Noon Lat 38° 59' N. Long 38° 53' W.
91. Tuesday May 20th All these 24 hours fresh breezes and fine weather heading by the wind to the Eastward one sail in sight. Noon Lat 39° 35' N. Long 34° 10' W.
92. Wednesday May 21th All these 24 hours fresh breezes & S.W. heading by the wind to the Eastward lowered 3 boats after blackfish without success. Noon Lat 39° 32' Long 33° 11' W.
93. Thursday May 22th All these 24 hours fresh breezes with passing fog. Squalls 2 sails in sight. Landed heading by the wind to E by N. Noon 39° 35' N. Long 32° 16' W.
94. Friday May 23th All these 24 hours fresh breezes & S.W. with passing squalls. Heading to the Eastward shortened sail. Headed to the N.W. May light to the East. 3 vessels in sight. Noon Lat 39° 58' N. Long 31° 43' W.
95. Saturday May 24th All these 24 hours fresh breezes and squally from E.S.E. to S.W. heading to the E. sunset took in sail headed to the S.W. May light saw the Island of Flores bearing S.E. 10 off a ship's mainmast to the E. & 10 tack to the E. Noon Lat 39° 26' N. Long
