

Ship Pacific off Western Islands 1851

96 Sunday May 25th All these 24 hours fresh breeze
E.S.E. to S.E. heading to the E. & S.W. lowered the boat
for a large stick of Pine timber about 85 feet long and
about 20 in square got it alongside. Caught 3 Fish
Cub from it. Braced forward to the S.W. daylight
the Island of Flores in sight bearing S.E. one sail
in sight. So ends heading S.W. by the wind.

Now Lat 39-14 N. Long.

97 Monday May 26th All these 24 hours fresh breeze
and equally heading to the S.E. by the wind
the Island of Flores and 2 sails in sight caught
2 Porpoises. sunset heading to the S.W. daylight
made sail sent down the foretop gallant yard. now
sent it aloft.

Now Lat 38-31. Long.

98 Tuesday May 27th All these 24 hours fresh
breeze from E. to S.E. heading to S.E. by the wind
sunset took in sail daylight made sail
nothing in sight.

Now Lat Long.

99 Wednesday 28th All these 24 hours fresh breeze
from E to S.E. the Islands of Corvo & Flores in sight
to the S.E. and one sail. ~~Off the latter part~~
heading by the wind to S.E.

100 Thursday 29th All these 24 hours fresh breeze.
heading in from land spoke a Whaler Brigg
of Provincetown. Masted out 75 lbs. Latter part
the Capt and the boats crew on shore so ends
laying off & on.

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101 Friday May 30th At 6 p.m. the Boat returned with
a few Potatoes. Cook Shop & Calf at 7 p.m. the Boat went
on shore & 10 p.m. the Boat and Capt returned. 11 the
Mate and 3 Mate went on shore so ends. Laying off and on
the Island of Flores

102 Saturday May 31st Laying off and on. 6 p.m. the
Boat returned. Spoke with a English Schooner Middle
& Latter parts Laying off & on. so ends

103 Sunday June 1st The Capt. left for shore board
with a Spanish brigg. 11 p.m. the Boat returned
Latter part standing in shore left the Stevedore

104 Monday June 2nd Standing off and on shore spoke
the Brigg. Beacon of Sandwich Chan Middle & Latter
parts heading to the S.E. Flores in sight

105 Tuesday June 3rd All these 24 hours moderate
breeze & E steering the S.E.

Now 38-35 Long 30-00

106 Wednesday June 4th All these 24 hours moderate
breeze & E heading to the S.E. nothing in sight.

Now 38-31

107 Thursday June 5th Light breeze & S.W. steering
E by S. Latter part saw the Island of Fayal's base E.
dist 30 miles

108 Friday June 6th Commenced with strong
breeze & S.W. running down between St George & Green
at 10 p.m. bore to with the Head Varies about daylight
Greenia in sight kept off passed Banks the Peri & President
of New Bedford a Brigg in sight. so ends
