

Ship Pacific off Western Islands. 1851

134. Tuesday July 1<sup>st</sup> Daylight Kept off for the East part of St. George. Pico bearing N by E. 5 M. saw sperm Whales covered the boats. Mated with the Harbinger boats the second Mate struck and crawled from a large Whale & 10 came on board headed to the S. W. with the Islands of Pico, Terceira, St. George & Graciosa in sight.

135. Wednesday July 2<sup>nd</sup> Commenced with fresh breezes and fine weather & kept off St. Michael. Part laying to with the main topsail to the mast daylight kept off running down between St. George & Graciosa spoke the Brig Harbinger & was 3 Miles in sight.

136. Thursday July 3<sup>rd</sup> Commenced with moderate breezes starting for the North Part of Fayal bearing S. W. Pico S. by E. St. George S. E. Graciosa E. boarded with the Brig Harbinger spoke the Ship named Allyn of N. B. 47 days out. Noil Middle Part standing off and on between Fayal & Pico daylight. Kept off for the North Point of Fayal. With haul by the wind to S. W. the Brig in sight.

137. Friday July 4<sup>th</sup> Commenced with strong breezes and pleasant standing off and on Fayal sunrise spoke the Ship Barnstable of N. B. & was this day standing in for Fayal.

138. Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> At 4 P. M. came to Anchor in the Harbour of Fayal 15 fathoms Water. Sent the Starboard Watch on shore on Liberty. Watch also on board except one man. He in the Prison. The Ship Comy C. Jones. of N. B. to Anchor 20 Months 20000. Ship South Corlina of N. B. clean and Brig Harbinger by Graciosa Captain Sylver.

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139. Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light breezes with rain one watch on shore so was this the Forces day.

140. Monday July 7<sup>th</sup> Light breezes and fine weather employed taking water on board, one watch on shore.

141. Tuesday July 8<sup>th</sup> Employed stowing water and other jobs one watch on shore.

142. Wednesday July 9<sup>th</sup> Employed getting off water and stowing down one watch on shore.

143. Thursday July 10<sup>th</sup> Employed getting off water and stowing down one watch on shore.

144. Friday July 11<sup>th</sup> Employed scraping down the lower masts and varnishing one watch on shore.

145. Saturday July 12<sup>th</sup> Employed getting under weigh and getting ready for sea at noon got under weigh and stood out towards Pico & spoke kept off S. E. between Fayal & Pico towards St. George stowed the Anchors.

146. Sunday July 13<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours light air with calm laying between St. George & Terceira the Brig Harbinger in sight and one watch.

147. Monday July 14<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours light air laying between St. George & Terceira employed stowing the onions in baskets 2 sails in sight.
