

Ship Pacific off the Western Islands 1851.

148 Tuesday July 15th Commenced with light breezes and fine weather. Spoke the Bark Noble of Tag Harbour clear and Brig Harbinger sunset took in sail daylight standing for St. George's. At 7 A.M. the Capt. left the ship for shore latter part standing off and on and stowing away potatoes.

149 Wednesday July 16th Commenced with light breezes and pleasant at 4 P.M. the Capt. returned with potatoes and Sails. 2 sails in sight sunset a boat came from shore trading Middle Part laying too with the head Sails to the Mast daylight kept off for the Island of Terrenia 2 sails in sight to land.

150 Thursday July 17th Commenced with light airs and pleasant heading for the N.E. part of Terrenia the sail in sight sunset standing off shore Middle part standing in shore daylight the Brig Harbinger close aboard. Saw Grampuses lowered 2 boats without success to land.

151 Friday July 18th Commenced with light breezes and pleasant breeze with the Brig Harbinger kept off for the Island of St. Michaels sunset St. Michaels bore S.E. by S. Latter part light breezes steering S.E. by S. the Brig in sight.

152 Saturday July 19th Commenced with light breezes and pleasant steering for the land the Brig in sight sunset headed off with the foretop sail to the Mast daylight kept off for the Bay. the Bark and the Brig in sight Latter part standing out and in the Bay in company with the Bark & Brig.

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153 Sunday July 20th Commenced with light breezes and pleasant cruising in the Bay at 4 P.M. boarded with the Bark James Anderson of N.B. clear sunset the Boat returned made sail and stood to the Westward Middle Part kept off S.W. Latter part heading for St. Mary's.

154 Monday July 21st All these 24 hours light breezes with frequent calms heading to the S. sunset St. Mary's bore S.E. St. Michaels bore N.E. by E. Latter part Calm sent down the Main top Yard to fift Noon St. Mary's bore E.S.E. dist 15 miles.

155 Tuesday July 22nd Commenced with light breezes and fine weather. 2 sails in sight at 4 P.M. sent the Main top gallant Yard aloft and sail sunset spoke the Ship Congree of N.B. clear. Steering to the South Latter part employed getting a new Fly Boom and getting it out. To land the Ship Congree in sight.

156 Wednesday July 23rd All these 24 hours light breezes and fine weather. Saw the Ship Congree 2 boats after Whales at 1 P.M. lowered our boats saw one whale Chase till sunset came on board kept off S.W.

157 Thursday July 24th All these 24 hours light breezes with calm heading to the S.W. one ship in sight employed in getting out a new Fly Boom. Noon Lat 33° 00' N. Long 25° 30' W.

158 Friday July 25th All these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant weather steering S.W. by Compass the Ship Congree in sight employed getting the Main top gallant Yard and other Yards.

Noon 32° 00' N Long 25° 00' W.
