

38 Ship Pacific Indian Ocean Nov. 1851.

260. Tuesday Nov. 4th All these 24 hours Moderate breezes and fair. S.W. steering E.S.E. nothing in sight. Noon Lat 38. Long 93.13 E.

261. Wednesday Nov. 5th All these 24 hours Fresh breezes & S.W. steering E.S.E. finbacks in sight. Noon Lat 37.49. Long 96. E.

262. Thursday Nov. 6th All these 24 hours Fresh breezes & S.W. squally nothing in sight. Noon Lat 37.36. Long 99 E.

263. Friday Nov. 7th All these 24 hours light breeze and fine weather steering to E.S.E. nothing in sight. Noon Lat 37.30. Long 102.30 E.

264. Saturday Nov. 8th All these 24 hours light breezes from S to S.E. heading by the wind from E.S.E. to E. Noon Sun Obs.

265. Sunday Nov. 9th All these 24 hours light breezes & S.W. steering S.E. by E. nothing in sight but finbacks. Noon Lat 37.50 S. Long 107.15 E.

266. Monday Nov. 10th All these 24 hours Moderate breezes from W. to S.W. heading S.E. by E. the sail in sight. Noon Lat 38.35 S.

267. Tuesday Nov. 11th All these 24 hours Fresh breezes from W.S.W. to S.W. heading S.E. by E. nothing in sight. Noon Lat 39.45 S. Long 112.40 E.

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268. Wednesday Nov. 12th Commenced with strong breezes & S.W. heading S.E. by E. & 3 P.M. saw a large Right Whale lowered 2 Boats without success. Middle Part strong breezes & S. and squally. Latter Part Moderate. Noon Lat 39.44 S. Long 114.49

269. Thursday Nov. 13th All these 24 hours strong breezes from S. to S.W. steering by the wind to the S.E. by E. saw finbacks. Noon Lat 40.25 S. Long 117.41

270. Friday Nov. 14th All these 24 hours Fresh breezes & S. heading to the E.S.E. finbacks in sight so much nothing going on of any consequence. Noon Lat 40.33 S. Long 120.48

271. Saturday Nov. 15th All these 24 hours Moderate breezes & S. heading E.S.E. by the wind. Plenty of finbacks in sight. Noon Sun Obs.

272. Sunday Nov. 16th First Part of these 24 hours light breezes & S. Middle Part the same. Latter Part moderate breezes & S.E. with passing foggy squalls. Plenty of finbacks in sight. Noon Lat 41.11 S. Long 123.40 E.

273. Monday Nov. 17th First Part of these 24 hours Fresh breezes & S.E. steering by the wind to E.S.E. at 4 spoke the Ship Florida and 2 Fairbanks 150 lbs Whale. & 5 saw 2 Right Whale lowered 2 Boats struck and killed one & 7 got the Whale alongside daylight. Commenced cutting & 11 finish'd took the head made sail the Ship Florida in sight. Noon Lat 40.23 S.
